

1. TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS.

a. Travel destinations and means of travel are unrestricted by this order. Travelers must comply with any Host Nation law regarding testing, quarantine, or restrictions on movement. Travelers may move by air, ground, or ship, but must comply with all restrictions imposed on that form of travel, as determined by law or by the rules set by commercial carriers. It is the individual duty of each traveler to be aware of these Host Nation and carrier requirements.

b. Leave and pass approval authorities may consider the impact of any Host Nation or U.S. movement restrictions when deciding whether to approve unofficial travel. The approval authority may deny travel if the ensuing restrictions on movement would interfere with mission accomplishment.

2. GROUPS, SOCIALIZING, AND ASSEMBLIES. In order to prevent the spread of COVID-19, respect Host Nation law, and maintain the ability to rapidly test, trace, and isolate, it is necessary to regulate social gatherings. The following rules govern social gatherings and events:

a. On-Post and Off-Post Housing (Family Housing and Barracks). In all on- and off-post housing, all personnel must continue to obey Host Nation law with regard to social gatherings. It is the individual duty of all personnel to be aware of these Host Nation limits.

b. On-Post events directed by unit commanders aimed at promoting unit cohesion, resiliency, and networks of mutual support (for example, ceremonies, SFRG meetings, or hail and farewell events) are permitted after medical risk mitigation review by the servicing local PHEO and approval by the Garrison Commander. These events may include a mix of vaccinated and un-vaccinated personnel, in numbers that exceed Host Nation limits, but risk mitigation reviews are required in order to ensure such events can be conducted in a safe manner.

3. OFF-POST ESTABLISHMENTS. Soldiers may patronize any establishment that Host Nation authorities deem safe to operate, but must abide by all Host Nation rules for their safe operation. The types of establishments that are open and allowed to operate may vary from location to location. It is the individual duty of all patrons to be aware of these Host Nation requirements.
