












Earth Day underlines importance of energy mitigation

Recent survey results show housing satisfaction on the rise

WASHINGTON – Results from a recent tenant survey show that overall customer satisfaction is improving, as the service continues to improve on-base living conditions. For the first time, this year's Tenant Satisfaction Survey was standardized across all military branches following a change in the National Defense Authorization Act to help paint a clearer picture of the state of military housing. Over 85,000 Army households took part in the anonymous questionnaire, an increase from previous years, and it had an array of positive results.

ANNISTON, Ala. – Anniston Army Depot's Stryker Exchange program continues to provide cost saving benefits to the Army and assist in efforts to modernize the Army's fleet of combat vehicles. Aimed at assisting in the conversion from the flat bottom hull Stryker to the double v hull Stryker A1, the Stryker Exchange program accomplishes this mission by reclaiming and repairing parts from the former vehicle that can be used on the updated DVH vehicles.
