#### COLONEL HARRY WALLACE FRENCH

### U.S. ARMY

Colonel Harry Wallace French was born on December 4, 1926 in Washington D.C. From July 1944 to June 1946, he served in the U.S. Navy in the Atlantic and Pacific Theater rising to the rank of Torpedo Man, Third Class.

Upon leaving the Navy, he entered Virginia Military Institute where he graduated as a Second Lieutenant in June 1950. His first assignment was in Korea where he served in successive positions as an Infantry Platoon Leader and Executive Officer in the Seventh Division.

Upon returning from Korea in 1951, he served as an Executive Officer and Company Commander with the Third Infantry Regiment at Fort Myer, Virginia, for a year and a half before departing to Germany in 1953 where he served as an Executive Officer in Company B, Eighteenth Infantry Regiment of the First Infantry Division. When the Division returned to the United States and Fort Riley, Kansas, he served as a Company Commander with the same Regiment and as the Aide-De-Camp to the Commanding General of the Big Red One.

From 1956 to 1959, he was stationed at Fort Benning, Georgia, first as a student in the Advance Course and then as an instructor in Company Tactics. During the next year to 1960, he completed the Command and General Staff College at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas.

Upon leaving Fort Leavenworth, he served as a Regimental Advisor in Vietnam until July 1961.

From 1961 to 1965, he served on the staff in the Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff, Personnel, Department of the Army, Washington D.C.

In July 1965, upon completing his tour in Washington, he returned to Germany where he was assigned as Chief, Training Maneuver Branch, G-3, VII Corps. In July 1966, he was transferred to the Second Battalion, Twenty-First Mechanized Infantry as Battalion Commander and returned to Fort Riley, Kansas, with the unit. Upon arriving at Fort Riley, he became the G-3 of the Twenty-Fourth Division until May of 1969.

From May 1969 to May 1970, he served as G-5, Twenty-Fourth Corps and Deputy Post Commander, Phu Bai Combat Base in Vietnam. Upon returning to the United States, he was assigned as the Professor of Military Science at Virginia Military Institute in Lexington, Virginia, from June 1970 to July 1972.

In July 1972, he assumed his current position as Director of Plans and Training of the US Army Training Center and Fort Dix, Fort Dix, New Jersey. Until Duguet (975.
