MANDATORY ON-POST HOUSING INSPECTIONS

JAN. 26-30:

As mandated by the National Defense Authorization Act, a third-party contractor will inspect all government-owned on-post quarters Jan. 26-30. Inspections take an hour to 90 minutes each and cover all environmental, health and safety conditions therein. Adults must be present, and if an appointment is not scheduled or no one is at home, the house will be opened with an escort. CIVILIAN TRAFFIC RECOMMENDED TO USE GATE 1 INSTEAD OF GATE 5

JAN. 27-31, FEB. 3-5:

Due to heavier than expected traffic at Gate 5 Jan. 27 through 31 and Feb. 3 through 5, civilian vehicles arriving onto post can instead use Gate 1 to access post.
