CIVIL AFFAIRS – Mission Set



Civil Network Development and Engagement - the activity by which the civil network capabilities and resources are engaged, evaluated, developed, and integrated into operations.

Transitional Governance - the actions taken to assure appropriate control and continuity of government functions throughout the range of military operations.



Civil-Military Integration - actions taken to establish, maintain, influence, or leverage relations between military forces and indigenous populations and institutions to synchronize, coordinate, and enable inter-organizational cooperation and to achieve unified action

Civil Knowledge Integration - actions taken to analyze, evaluate, and organize collected civil information for operational relevance and informing the warfighting function.

Achieve a decisive advantage when firepower or physical control of a terrain feature are not enough to win.

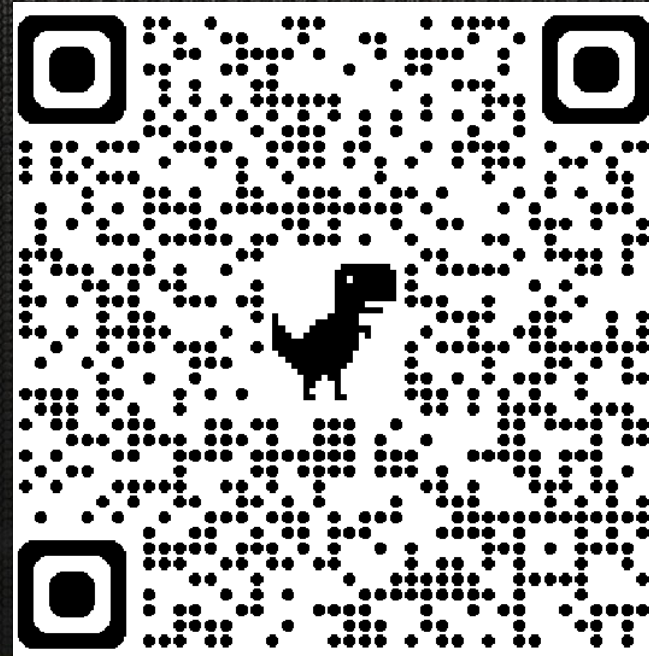
