It is everyone's responsibility to minimize the pollution of our environment. We can do this by avoiding, reducing, separating and recycling of waste.

This pamphlet describes the recycling procedures on post for all areas. It applies to all units, organizations, activities, directorates, contractors, residents, soldiers and civilians on Rose Barracks.

It is against German law to bring trash on post.

The only exceptions are household hazardous waste and, if in an urgent need and no other disposal place is available, then bulky items, electric and electronic items including appliances and entertainment equipment can be taken to the Recycle Center on post.

Why Recycle?

➤ **Recycling saves our environment.**

Recycling saves energy in making new items, saves trees, saves landfill space, reduces our oil demand and reduces pollution.

- ✓ A 3-foot stack of recycled paper saves one tree. Every ton of recycled paper saves 17 trees.
- ✓ Producing paper from recycled paper uses about 65 % less energy and 61 % less water than making paper from trees.
- ✓ One recycled bottle saves enough energy to run a 100-watt light bulb for four hours.
- ✓ Making aluminum products from recycled aluminum creates 95 % less pollution and uses 90 % less energy than making the same product from raw material.

➤ **Recycling saves community dollars.**

Waste disposal cost account for a significant share of the garrison's utility bill.

Refuse goes to expensive incineration. Recycling material inappropriately dumped in refuse containers unnecessarily contributes to higher cost. Metal items in refuse frequently do severe damages to our refuse shredder and cause "sky high" repair cost. Hazardous material in refuse or recycling containers may turn the whole load of a garbage truck into hazardous waste with astronomic disposal prices. **Disposal of recyclable material placed in appropriate containers costs a lot less** because the profit from selling the material goes into contractors' calculations when bidding for contracts.

Let us save that money! Everybody can contribute!

➤ **Recycling is mandatory by law in Germany.**

Waste disposal falls under the jurisdiction of the German communities. All wastes from private households must be left to the public waste disposal system. You are subject to German recycling laws and rules just like your German neighbors.

➤ **Recycling is mandatory for everyone IAW Garrison Trash Separation Policy and Final Governing Standards for Germany (FGS-G).**

Reducing Waste

- The best thing to do for our environment is to avoid trash.
Where this is not possible, try to reduce it.

- **Here are some hints:**
 - ✓ plan your shopping
 - ✓ avoid products with excessive packing
 - ✓ buy unpacked goods
 - ✓ buy fresh fruits and vegetables instead of deep frozen or canned goods - they have more vitamins too
 - ✓ individually wrapped servings do not make good ecological sense
- they also cost more
 - ✓ avoid laminated material (like plastic coated cartons or paper)
- it is expensive to recycle
 - ✓ buy your beverages in reusable bottles (deposit)
- they are being reused up to 60 times
 - ✓ look for natural products - they are a lot easier to recycle
 - ✓ use a shopping basket or cloth bags instead of plastic bags

- **Give away instead of throw away.**

Give no longer needed stuff that is still useable to others to the Thrift Shop or to charity. For example, good used clothing including shoes to the Red Cross.

- **Closing the loop.**

Look for items in packaging made from recycled materials.
Buy products fully or partially made from recycled materials.
Set the trend to make recycling succeed.

General Guidance:

➤ **Keep the material in recycling containers pure.**

Put only the appropriate material in recycling containers. If a container is “contaminated” with refuse or other (recyclable) material that does not belong in there, the whole content ends up as refuse and we pay the higher price. The contractor also may deny service until deficiencies are corrected.

➤ **No recyclable material in refuse containers.**

The garbage men may leave your containers un-serviced.

➤ **No hazardous waste, electronic waste or bulky items in recycling or refuse containers.**

Household type hazardous waste must be brought to the DPW Self Help Store. Units and organizations must turn in their hazardous waste through the DPW Environmental Office.

Because of hazardous components, European laws strictly forbid disposal of electric and electronic items as well as batteries in normal trash.

Housing residents should bring electronic waste and bulky items including appliances to the Rose Barracks Recycling Center. Units and organizations must follow proper supply procedures.

➤ **Keep container lids closed.**

It sure looks nicer, keeps insects away and prevents animals from sifting through your trash and littering the area.

➤ **Do not put anything on the ground.**

Material outside of containers is not picked up, no matter if it is in bags or loose. Material too large or in excess of container capacity may be brought to the Rose Barracks Recycle Center.

➤ **Watch pickup days.**

Refuse and recycling containers are serviced on a routine schedule. In barracks, admin areas and motorpools the contractor will collect from designated container places (recycling points). In the housing areas bins are individually assigned to an apartment. Residents must place them on the curbside before 07:30 of pickup days. Please use this service always, even if your container is only half full or less. This will help to avoid eventual excess and overflow. Pickup schedules will be provided.


Containers & Locations:

- Container colors have a meaning.

Black or gray = refuse

Green = paper & cardboard

Yellow = plastics / composite materials & metal cans

- Containers for refuse, paper/cardboard and plastics/composite material & metal cans are either assigned to individual homes (housing) or placed centrally within a group of buildings or an area. Containers for excess material are at the Rose Barracks Recycling Center.
- Igloo type containers for glass are placed at various locations on Rose Barracks (see list on page 11) and at the Rose Barracks Recycle Center.
- Containers for used clothing are located at the Rose Barracks Recycling Center. The material goes to the Red Cross.
- Containers for dry-cell batteries are placed at numerous locations around post (Recycling Center, Commissary, other common places, gyms, motor pools, and barracks in buildings as well as recycling points outside.
- Household type bulky material, furniture, electric and electronic waste including appliances, tires, scrap metal, scrap wood is centrally collected at the Rose Barracks Recycling Center. Detailed information is on pages 12 - 13.
-  Note: Units, organizations or activities must turn in their scrap metal, tires, furniture, office equipment, etc. through the supply system (DLA, RSSA)
- Containers for scrap wood from units, organizations or activities are located at the DPW Yard, bldg. # 140, Monday – Friday, 07:30 – 16:00
- For household hazardous waste please use the DPW Self Help Store on Rose Barracks Vilseck.
- Automobile hazardous wastes including tires should primarily be returned to garages and shops that sell those items. They can also be disposed of at the MWR Skills Centers (see page 15). Tires are also accepted at the Recycle Center on post.

What goes where?

A. Curbside Pickups:



➤ Refuse -> black or gray containers

It includes sweepings, full vacuum cleaner bags, cigarette butts, ash, soot, used napkins and paper towels, dirty paper, used wall paper, soiled plastic wrapping, rubber, diapers, food waste, window and mirror glass, china, porcelain, stoneware, crystal, pet litter, etc.

Please no recyclable materials like paper, cartons, glass or metals.

Please no bulky items, electronic or hazardous materials or wastes.

Please do not put in hot charcoal or ash.

Pickups: Housing every other week, barracks and other areas once or three times per week.



➤ Recyclable Paper & Cardboard -> green containers

Must be clean! It includes news papers, catalogues, writing paper, books, notebooks, shopping bags, envelopes, clean napkins and paper towels, clean wrapping paper, cardboard and cartons like cereal boxes, etc.

Staples, plastic address windows on envelopes and cardboard hard covers from books does not have to be removed.

Please cut / fold boxes to save space.

Remove all styrofoam and plastic filling material and wrapping.

Please do not put in dirty paper of any kind, carbon paper, diapers, wallpaper or wax or plastic coated paper products.

Please no milk- or other beverage cartons (Plastic).

Please do not put in with plastic bags.

Pickups: Housing every other week, barracks and other areas once or three times per week.



Take excess cardboard/cartons and large boxes to the Rose Barracks Recycling Center (see pages 12 – 13).

➤ **Plastics / composite materials & metal cans -> yellow containers**

I.e. empty plastic packaging and wrapping, shopping bags, yogurt & pudding cups, aluminum foil, -lids, -trays, chips' bags, noodles' bags, candy wrappers, fruit nets, foam trays, plastic bottles, -canisters, -buckets, styrofoam parts & -chips, composite material, beverage cartons, waxed milk cartons, etc.



Empty metal cans of all kind including aluminum, like soda cans, food cans, completely empty spray cans from deodorant, hairspray, shaving foam, metal lids from jars and bottles, small metal items like clothing hangers, etc. Labels does not have to be removed.



Please no recyclable materials like paper, cartons or glass.

Please no other refuse or electronic or hazardous wastes.

Pickups: Housing every other week, barracks and other areas once a week.



Only at Spring Clean Up and Fall Clean Up there is a curbside Pick Up for Bulky items on designated locations. During the year it is prohibited to place the Bulk Trash curbside or at the Cul-de-sacs!

B. Glass Container Points

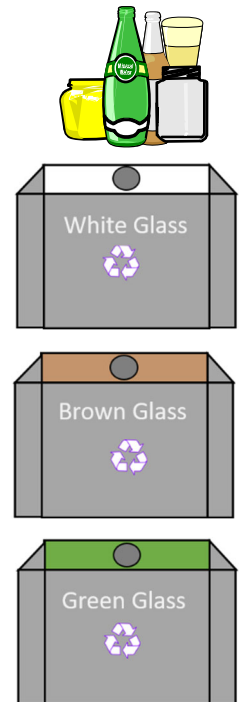
➤ Bottles and jars only.

Please separate by colors (clear, brown and green). Look for the labeling on containers. Clear glass and brown glass must be kept absolutely pure. Other colors can be put in the containers for green glass.

Please remove lids. Labels doesn't have to be removed.

Please do not put in window glass, windshields, mirrors, china, stoneware or crystal (put in refuse). Also, no light bulbs - fluorescent light bulbs and energy efficient lamps are hazardous waste because of their heavy metal contents, regular lamps are refuse.

Please do not put in with plastic or paper bags.



➤ Glass Container Locations on Post:

C. Rose Barracks Recycle Center:

- **For Plastics, bulky items, “green waste”, scrap metal, electric and electronic waste and other recyclables**
- **Purpose:** Central collection point for bulky waste and excess of recyclable material and refuse from private households on post.
- **Location:** On the road to the Self Help Store and DPW, on the right, just before building # 102 (CIF).
- **Opening hours:**

Tuesdays and Thursdays	11:00 – 16:00
Saturdays	10:00 – 15:00
- **Attendance:** By contractor personnel. The attendant's primary function is to observe and guide proper sorting and placement of material and to answer questions regarding separation of waste for recycling.



Note: Material from unit or organizational property must be turned in using the proper supply procedures and will not be accepted at the recycling center. Scrap metal must be turned in to DLA Grafenwoehr with prior coordination through RSSA Vilseck. Scrap wood from units or organizations must be brought to the containers at the DPW yard (bldg. # 140).

■ Separate containers for:

- **Scrap Metal:** All kind of metal and metal parts, including stoves, tent frames and poles, strollers, ironing boards, rims, tools, bicycles, barbecue grills, metal furniture, gasoline powered lawnmower etc.
*Please no material that is contaminated with oil or grease and no automotive waste.
Please no propane or butane gas containers and no fire extinguishers (->hazardous waste).*
- **Tires:** Separate containers for tires on rims and without rims.
If possible, please dismantle your tires and place the rims in the container for scrap metal.

- **Electronic Waste and Appliances:** TV's, video and stereo equipment, radios, CD players, computers, printers, microwaves, refrigerators, freezers, fluorescent lamps, washers, dryers, toasters, electro powered lawnmower etc.
Please handle items carefully. Do not throw. Do not break.
- **Scrap Wood:** All kinds of scrap wood and wooden furniture, wood chips, pressed wood, plywood, sawdust, etc.
Please dismantle furniture and remove metal and plastic parts as far as possible.
- **Upholstered Furniture:** Sofas, mattresses, carpets, rugs, large hard plastic items, large products that consist of a mix of materials and cannot be dismantled with reasonable effort, etc.
Please no material that falls under the categories above.
- **Used Clothing and Home Textiles:** Donations to the Red Cross. Please put items in closed (tied) bags. Matching pairs of shoes should be tied together.
- **Batteries:** Lead acid (car) batteries from privately owned vehicles. *Please handle carefully to avoid spills.*
Also separate containers for dry cell batteries.
- **Excess cardboard, glass, paper, metal cans, plastics and refuse:** These containers are strictly for the use of people residing on post. *Off post residents must use the disposal system of their German Community. Bringing normal refuse and recyclable material on post is a violation of German law! Also, the U.S. government pays high waste fees to the German communities. If brought on post, we would pay again for the disposal.*

D. Other Non-Hazardous Material

- **“Green” Waste** -> across from Self Help Store

The term “green waste” stands for compostable material. It includes grass, yard trimmings, leaves, bushes, small trees, garden soil, flowers, plants, etc.

Please do not dump with plastic bags! No food waste!

- **Scrap Wood** from Units -> DPW Yard

Units, activities and organizations must deliver their scrap wood to the containers at the DPW Yard, bldg. # 140.

Metal parts and other material must be removed.



No wooden ammunition packing material! => Turn in to ASP.

E. Hazardous and Automotive Waste:

- **Household Hazardous Waste** -> Self Help Store

Household type hazardous waste includes cleaners, acids, bases, solvents, aerosols, paint, thinners, strippers, antifreeze, oil, car batteries, dry cell batteries, fluorescent light bulbs, propane or butane gas containers, fire extinguishers, etc.

You can also find **Dry cell battery collection containers** at numerous locations **on post** (Recycling Center, PX, Commissary, barracks, other common buildings & places, etc).

Note: Car batteries, dry cell batteries and waste oil should primarily be disposed of at the shops where they are sold. Stores on the German economy that sell these items are required by law to take back used batteries and waste oil at no extra cost for the consumer.

The DPW Self Help Store is located on Wilbur Road, building # 103.

Open on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Friday from 09:00 – 15:45,
Thursday from 10:00 – 17:00, Saturday from 08:00 – 14:00.

■ Automobile Hazardous Waste -> different options

Car parts, tires, batteries, waste oil, engines and engine parts should primarily be turned in at garages, gas-stations and stores where you buy your replacements. Tires usually cost a small disposal fee. Batteries may cost a deposit if you do not return a used battery when buying a new one. Sellers are required by German law to take back waste oil at no extra cost for the consumer.

Cars, car parts, engines, engine parts, also batteries and waste oil can be disposed of at the MWR Auto Skills Centers, Rose Barracks Vilseck, bldg. # 711, or East Camp Grafenwoehr, bldg. # 528. For more info, hours please refer to their webpage <http://www.grafenwoehrmwr.com/autocrafts.html>.

The DPW Self Help Store also accepts car batteries and waste oil.

Tires and batteries can also be disposed of at the Rose Barracks Recycle Center free of charge.

Sorting in Buildings, Offices, Quarters:

- Separation of material at the point where it becomes trash is the key to successful recycling.
- In accordance with the garrison's trash separation policy, commanders, directors of organizations and activities and supervisors at all levels are responsible for implementing recycling policies within their area. As a minimum, adequate separation systems for the types of waste generated must be established in each building, common area, office or shop.
- Standard waste baskets, available from GSA, labeled with self-made signs, are one cheap way to set up such a sorting system within an office, classroom or in a common-use area. For information on other solutions, please contact the Sort Program Coordinator at DPW O&M Division, Utilities Branch Vilseck, DSN 599-4032 or Civilian 09641-70-599-4032.
- At buildings with routine contractual custodial services the cleaning personnel will take pre-separated waste to the next appropriate container within the standard service frequencies. However, it is the user's responsibility to separate. Custodial personnel are obligated to refuse service on unsorted trash. This service includes only normal office amounts, not large quantities resulting from the specific operation of activities. Also, if the receptacles fill up sooner than the service intervals, then users must take care of their waste themselves.



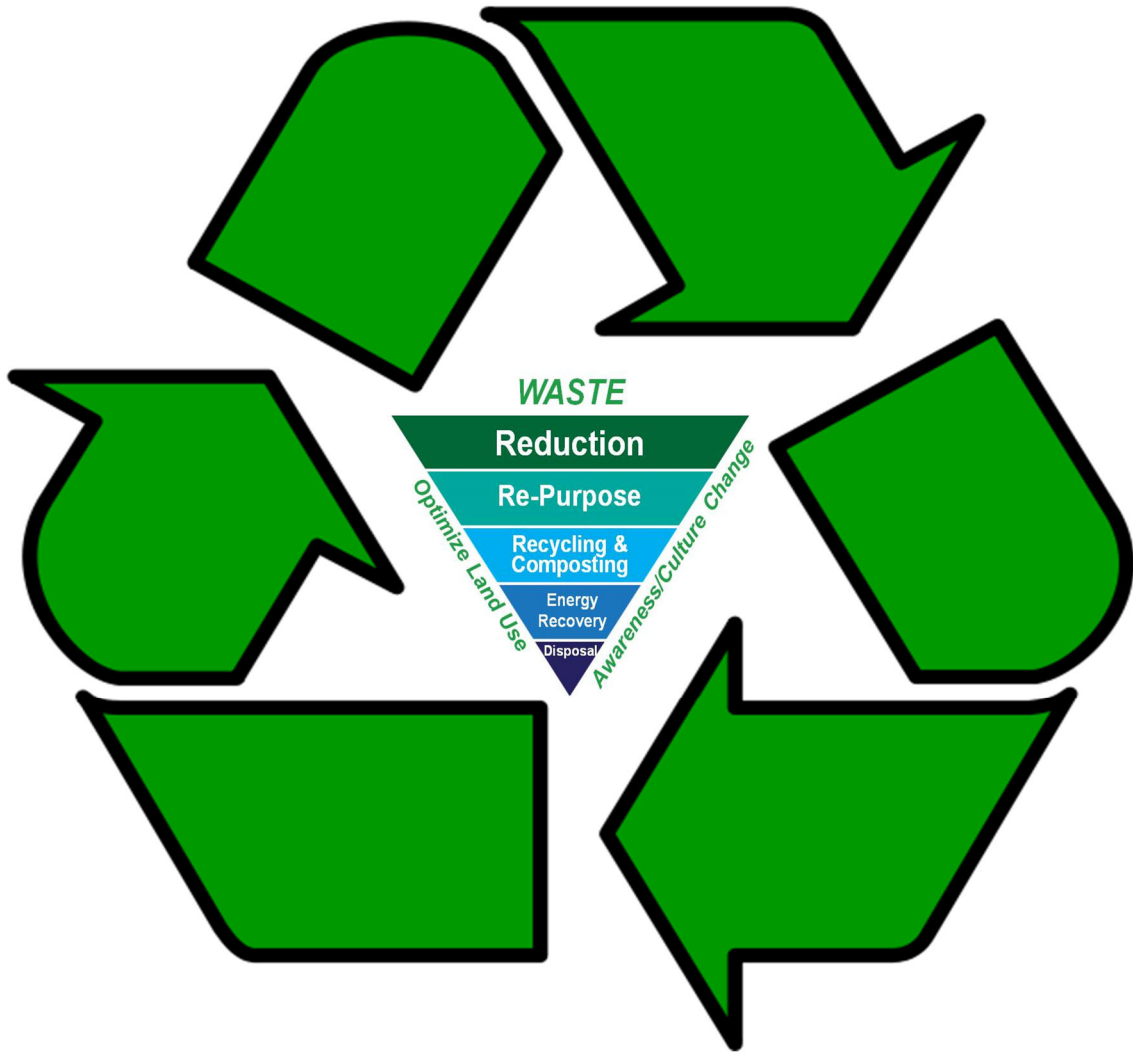
