



U.S. electrical appliances normally are built for 120 Volts








Do NOT use adapters!!


You will risk destroying your U.S. electrical appliances.

You will either need to use a 120 Volt outlet in your quarters or a 230V/120V transformer if you use a 230V outlet.









If an automatic circuit breaker which protects the circuit is triggered, the power supply is interrupted. To switch the circuit breaker back on, simply toggle the switch back up.

Stains, burn marks, scratches on flooring are not FWT (fair wear and tear). FWT will be determined by a qualified Inspector (AR735-5c-4).





Correct airing of your bathrooms to avoid mold from developing

- During showering/bathing, your bathroom door must be closed.
- Open the bathroom window wide after showering and keep the doors closed for another 10 to 15 minutes.







Correct airing of your bathrooms without windows

- During showering/bathing, the ceiling lamp must be turned on.
- Keep the bathroom door closed during showers.
- Switch off the light after showering and keep doors closed for another 10-15 minutes.











Kitchen: Metal vent filter can be cleaned in the dishwasher.



- Carefully remove the metal filters from the holders.
- If slightly soiled you can place the filters vertically in the machine.
- If heavily soiled, it is best to place the filters horizontally in the dishwasher.
- Choose an intensive program and let the machine go through. Before doing so, make sure that the rinse arms can rotate freely.












STAIRWELL BUILDING

- Keep fire doors closed
- Keep all common areas clean (including entrance area, stairwell, basement and attic)
- Keep storage rooms clean, locked, and free of material constituting fire hazards.
- Family housing furniture will not be stored in basement
- Building exterior: Keep areas around buildings clean (including concrete sidewalks, outside steps, building entrances, rear and side basement steps, parking lots and dumpster areas)








Heating System


