RENEW US FORCES CERTIFICATE LICENSE:

Applicants may apply for a license renewal up to 60 calendar days before the license expires. This 60-day period applies to all vehicle classes. Applicants for renewal must complete AE Form 190-1T and an eye test and pay the required license fees. Applicants may submit AE Form 190-1T to renew an expired U.S. Forces Certificate of License up to 1 year after the license has expired without having to take the written test; after 1 year, applicants will be required to take the written test. The 1-year grace period applies only to license renewal; it is not an authorization to drive with an expired Certificate of License. Individuals must have a valid country or U.S. State drivers license in order to renew an expired U.S. Forces Certificate of License. USPS REQUIRES ONLINE CUSTOMS FORMS

NOW:

Official postal center mail that weighs 16 ounces or more (regardless of content, value, shape or mail class) or that contains a good (regardless of weight, shape or mail class) must bear a properly completed, computer-generated customs declaration form. It is recommended customers complete the online customs declaration form prior to visiting the postal service center, but a computer will be available for use at Hohenfels Postal Service Center regardless. REPLICA FIREARMS RESULT IN MAIL RETURNS NOW:

Because X-ray machines at Frankfurt cannot distinguish between firearms and fakes (including toy guns and wooden guns carved onto plaques), these items will not be able to deliver to the U.S. To learn more, ask about prohibited and restricted items at the Army Post Office or call 09472-708-7186 or DSN 522-7186.

PROPER PACKAGING OF LIQUIDS SENT IN MAIL:

The Postal Service Center has received an increase in wet and soiled mail parcels being damaged as other packages within the mail bag had contained liquid that was not properly packed. Postal guidelines for packages containing more than four ounces of liquid must be triple-packaged and include absorbent material capable of absorbing all of the liquid in the container in case of breakage. MAJOR CHANGE SENDING MPS, NOW IDS:

Next time patrons send a personal package or letter to another Army post office or the like, they must change the endorsement in the upper right hand corner to "IDS" for Intra/intertheater Delivery Systems. IDS has replaced the now-defunct MPS endorsement, formally referred to as Military Postal Service. Items may still be shipped for free if it is going to an Armed Forces Europe (AE) location. Items containing household goods or those shipped to Armed Forces America (AA) or Armed Forces Pacific (AP) may require postage.

NOTE ON SHIPPING PERSONAL PROPERTY:

Transport of personal property in connection with a permanent change of station or temporary duty move may not be sent free of charge. Uniforms and military gear, required to perform official duties at the next duty station may be the exception. For personal items, such use of the IDS requires coordination with the transportation office to ensure weights being shipped comply with official orders. For further assistance call the postal service center at DSN 522-2887 / 7185 or contact your local transportation office.

AUTOMATION CAN HELP SAVE TIME AT POSTAL SERVICE CENTER:

Mailing off packages can be much easier when customers complete the forms at home.

Don't let vague customs descriptions ("electronics," "gifts," "household goods," "sporting goods"); prohibited items (cigarettes, hand sanitizer, vape items, etc.) and others slow or stop your mail from moving through the postal system. Your items must clear an online customs clearance check in order to leave the postal facility. We highly recommend you complete your online customers form at USPS.COM before arriving at the Postal Service Center. To learn more, call 522-7186/2887.

EXPRESS SERVICE CUTOFF

DAILY:

Effective immediately, the Hohenfels Postal Service Center (PSC), Bldg. 327, has applied a daily 3 p.m. cutoff for Express Mail Service. CUSTOMS TIPS FOR YOUR GERMANY HOME BUSINESS:

A home-based business can be many things – selling aroma candles, kitchen containers or skin care products. Maybe photography or child care is what you like best. Whatever your preference, you have to follow German and military policies for your home-based business. Before beginning your business, contact your installation commercial affairs officer. He or she will tell you about local policies and help you gain permission from the base or garrison commander for the business. On the German side, you will first need to register your small business and then find out whether or not it will be subject to taxation by German authorities. It is highly recommended that you discuss that question with a legal professional. On top of that, you may need an entry in the register of companies and other licenses. From a customs angle, the first point to note is that U.S. Forces plated vehicles are for your personal use only. Using one as part of a business is illegal. Examples of abuse would be if you used your U.S. Army Europe-plated van to deliver goods to customers, transport children as a child care provider or import pottery from Poland for resale, said Tim Sellman, director of the U.S. Army Europe Customs Executive Agency. Register your business vehicle in the German system to be legal, he advised. The second point is that mail that you send or receive as part of your business must go through a commercial shipping company or the German postal service. The APO system is an entitlement for your personal use and using it to send or receive business wares and letters is not allowed. Third, you must declare any goods intended for resale to German Customs when you bring them into the country. If you buy commercial items in other countries, you must stop at the border and tell German customs your goods are for resale, Sellman stated. You are not allowed to use AE Form 550-175A - Import/Export Certificate & Purchase Permit - to avoid paying duty. Goods sold in the commissary, post or base exchange, and AAFES catalog are tax-free so you cannot buy anything there for your business either. Examples could be a computer for running the business or baking supplies for a cake enterprise. Not surprisingly, using VAT forms to support your business is off limits too. People who don't follow the rules risk receiving a hefty fine and tax demand from German authorities, and military administrative or civilian misconduct action as well, where applicable. Here are the main points again: -

- Do not use tax-free gasoline or a U.S. Army Europe plated POV for business activities.
- Do not use the military postal service to send or receive any business-related materials or mail.
- Do not use customs entitlements to import or export merchandise, advertising materials or other business-related materials.

- Do not use any item bought in the PX or commissary for your business
- Do not used VAT forms for any item intended or commercial purposes.
- Do not use Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation facilities, such as photo or craft shops, to support your business

• Do not store merchandise in your government quarters or use them as a showroom. Almost all business-related income must be reported to both German and American tax authorities. So – are you running a business? Do you need a German tax number or tax ID? Talk to your installation commercial affairs officer to be sure where you stand and get a Customs brief before you start.
