Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol for Former Training Areas, Fort Belvoir, Virginia

The U.S. Army Environmental Command (USAEC) has updated the Munitions Response Site Prioritization Protocol (MRSPP) at five former military training areas on Fort Belvoir, Virginia to assign the sites a relative priority for response activity. The Combat Range Complex, Infiltration Course, and the Fort Belvoir North Area Child Development Center (CDC) sites have been returned to Fort Belvoir inventory with land use controls; and munitions training/disposal sites M-33 and M-34 have been cleared for Military Construction (MILCON) redevelopment.

Fort Belvoir is one of many Department of Defense (DoD) military installations throughout the United States that is reviewed under the MRSPP. This protocol is used to prioritize former munitions response sites with a potential for unexploded ordnance, discarded military munitions or munitions constituents with regard to future actions.
