## Stay safe, remain vigilant during the holidays

As the fall and winter seasons begin in Europe, many activities, such as festivals, concerts, and markets occur throughout the European theater.

Unfortunately, in the past few years we have seen that events and venues like these can also attract terrorists. Our hosts are actively protecting these events, but our adversaries, many of whom are inspired by terrorist organizations, are limiting their exposure and employing attack methods that do not raise suspicion, such as vehicle ramming and edged weapons. With current threats increasingly difficult to detect and deter, individual awareness and vigilance play an even greater role. We must think and prepare individually, and apply relevant and effective measures to help reduce risk to ourselves, friends and families.

Along with the numerous holiday season events and New Year celebrations, U.S. Army Garrison Benelux personnel and family members should avoid areas of civil demonstrations or gatherings and follow instructions of local police authorities. Personnel should also monitor social media and local news outlets.

USAG Benelux will publish notifications of planned demonstrations. However, so-called "pop-up" demonstrations

can occur without warning. Have a plan when traveling to and from the airport, train station or any other location and make sure everyone in your group knows the plan.

If you see suspicious behavior at your garrison's location, please do not hesitate and report it to the military police desk at your location:

## Remembering World War I

In 1918, on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month, World War I ended.

A hundred years later, the Benelux community remembered what we

call today Armistice Day, or Veterans Day, a universally recognized day of commemoration.

Many cities held a ceremony to honor those who sacrificed their lives.

## Recognizing the early voices of our nation

November is Native American Heritage Month, honoring American Indians and Alaskan Natives. The theme for 2018 is "Sovereignty, Trust and Resilience."

During national Native American and Alaskan Native Heritage Month, we celebrate the legacy of the first people to call America home. The Native Americans have fortified our country with their traditions and values, making tremendous contributions to every aspect of our national life.

According to Defense Equal Opportunity Management Institute, there are 567 federally recognized American Indian and Alaska Native tribes and more than 100 state-recognized tribes across the U.S. DEOMI stated that, "Each have their own distinctive history, beliefs, governance structure and culture."


The observance has a long history. In 1915, the annual Congress for the American Indian Association meeting in Lawrence, Kansas, formally approved a plan concerning American Indian Day. President Calvin Coolidge issued a proclamation Sept. 28, 1915 that declared the second Saturday of each Courtesy graphic. May as an American Indian Day and contained the first formal appeal for recognition of American Indians as citizens. The year before the proclamation was issued, Red Fox James, a Blackfoot Indian, rode horseback from state to state seeking approval for a day to honor American Indians. On Dec. 14, 1915, he presented the endorsements of 24 state governments at the White House.

The first American Indian Day in a state was declared on the second Saturday in May 1916 by the governor of New York. Several other states celebrated the fourth Friday in September. Additionally, several states designated Columbus Day as Native American Day, but it continued to be a day observed without any real recognition.

In 1990, President George H. W. Bush approved a joint resolution designating November as National American Indian Heritage Month. Similar proclamations, under variants on the name (including "Native American Heritage Month" and "National American Indian and Alaska Native Heritage Month") have been issued each year since 1994.

In 2014, then President Barack Obama wrote, "Every year, our Nation pauses to reflect on the profound ways the First Americans have shaped our country's character and culture. The first stewards of our environment, early voices for the values that define our Nation, and models of government to our Founding Fathers - American Indians and Alaska natives helped build the very fabric of America. Today, their spirit and many contributions continue to enrich our communities and strengthen our country."

Native Americans have influenced every stage of America's



development. They are woven deeply into our nation's rich tapestry. They helped early European settlers survive and thrive in a new world.

This year, President Donald Trump wrote in his proclamation that "Our Nation is proud of and grateful for its Native American heritage and traditions, including a history of innovation and entrepreneurship. The essential contributions of Native Americans continue to strengthen our American family and brighten our future together."

The U.S. Department of Defense along with the rest of the nation, will celebrate the first people to live on the land we all value. American Indians and Alaska Natives bravely defended and shaped our country's character and our cultural heritage. American Indian and Alaskan Native patriots will continue to build legacies of freedom and diversity.

During Native American Heritage Month, we will honor the first Americans and recognize their contributions and their sacrifices.

## Follow safe cooking practices

Thanksgiving, or Turkey Day, is observed next Thursday. As you plan your Thanksgiving feasts in Europe, don't forget about fire safety. Did you know Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires? According to the U.S. Fire Administration, the average number of home fires on Thanksgiving is expected to be more than double the average number of fires in residential buildings on all other days of the year. Thanksgiving fires occured most frequently from noon to 3 p.m., when people were most likely preparing their meals.

Keep these safety tips in mind as you prepare your meals:

#### **TURKEY**

If you are roasting your turkey, make sure you set a timer. This way, you won't forget about the bird as you watch the parade or football. If you are frying your turkey, use a fryer with thermostat controls. This will ensure the oil does not become overheated. In addition, you should thaw your turkey completely. Ice on the bird will cause

the oil to splatter. Don't overfill the pot with oil. If you do, the oil will overflow when you add the turkey causing a fire hazard. Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the fryer. Also, always use the fryer outdoors.

#### STUFFING AND POTATOES

You should stand by your stove when you are boiling potatoes or frying onions for stuffing. It is best to stay in the kitchen when you are frying, boiling or broiling. If you are in the kitchen, it is easier to catch spills or hazardous conditions before they become a fire.

#### **VEGETABLES**

You should keep the area around the stove clear of packaging, paper towels, dish cloths and any flammable item. Be sure to clean up any spills as they happen. Keep a large pan lid or baking sheet handy in case you need to smother a pan fire. Lastly, turn pot handles towards the back of the stove so you don't bump them.

Please remember that unattended cooking is the leading factor in home-cooking fires. By following these tips, you will have a delicious and fire-safe Thanksgiving. Let the firefighters have dinner with their families, not yours.

## Highway Construction and Road Closures

You may experience some delays while driving in the Benelux this season. Road construction projects are occurring throughout the countries and may result in temporary lane closures and road congestion. We will provide regular updates to ensure that the community is informed and prepared.



Mons: From Nov. 5 to the end of the year, drivers traveling on the R5 from Mons won't be able to acess the E42-E19/A7 in the direction of Paris/Tournai and will have to follow a deviation or detour.



Gilly (N90): The speed of traffic is reduced to 50 km/h on N90 in Gilly, in the direction of Mons, due to road construction. Work is scheduled to be completed by the end of November.



Mons: A new construction project started in the center of the town Nov. 5 for the refurbishment of Cinema Plaza Art. During the 500 days, the Rue des Fossés will be closed each day from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m., and it won't be possible to park around the street.



Brussels: Due to road construction, try to avoid Avenue Franklin Roosevelt until mid-December.



Brussels: The tunnels of the roundabout Leonard will be closed from Nov. 15 at 10 p.m. to Nov. 16 at 5 a.m. Drivers will have to follow a deviation, or detour. There is expected to be road congestion.



Brussels: Road construction is still ongoing in the Reyers-Montgomery Tunnel in both directions and in the Reyers-Meiser Tunnel in the direction of the E40. Drivers who travel to Brussels from the ring are advised to use alternative routes via the A12, the Leopold III Tunnel and the E411. Work is scheduled to be completed by the end of the year.



Schinnen (A76): Due to the construction of the new on and off ramps on A76 (Highway Heerlen-Geleen), exit Schinnen #4 from Heerlen towards Geleen is closed. This results in the closure of the hard shoulder on both sides of the highway and a speed restriction of 70 km per hour until Jan. 31, 2019. Traffic should follow the yellow signs directing them to exit #2 Geleen-Beek and then access #2 on the A76 direction to Beek-Schinnen. The new A76 on and off ramps are scheduled to be completed this fall.
