**MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD**

**SUBJECT: Command Policy 2022-002 – Off-Post Uniform Wear Policy**

1. **Purpose.** The purpose of this memorandum is to implement off-post uniform wear for activities in the Army Support Activity – Black Sea (ASA-BS) Area of Responsibility (AOR). This policy is being implemented in accordance with U.S. Army Regulation (AR) 525-13, Antiterrorism; HQ USEUCOM AT OPORD 20-12; U.S. Army in Europe Regulation (AER) 525-13, Antiterrorism; and USAREUR-AF FRAGORD 01 to OPORD 0020-21 (FY21-FY22 Baseline FP Posture).

2. **Applicability.** This policy applies to all military personnel assigned to or performing temporary duty within the ASA-BS AOR under the Tactical Control for Force Protection (TACON for FP) of the V Corps Commanding General in the role of General Officer for Force Protection (GOFP) for Romania and Bulgaria.

3. **Background.** Uniform wear policies are risk-informed and Commanders continuously assess risk. The current ongoing crisis in Ukraine has led to an increased presence of Department of Defense (DoD) personnel and subsequent attention to U.S. activities in Romania and Bulgaria. Malign actors may use DoD uniformed presence outside of our installations to reinforce anti-U.S. narratives. As the U.S. presence is becoming more noticeable, uniformed personnel may be targeted for collection, harassment, crime or other hostile actions.

4. **Policy.**

a. Effective immediately, Commanders may allow the wear of Army uniforms in accordance with AR 670-1, off installations in accordance with the conditions below.

(1) Uniform wear is authorized only for official travel during the following circumstances.

(a) Official travel conducted by the Movement Control Teams (MCT) in tactical vehicles between MKAB, Romania and the Port of Constanta.

(b) Official travel in tactical vehicles between MKAB, Romania and NSTA, Bulgaria.

(2) Exiting a vehicle while wearing the Army uniform for the circumstances specified above is not authorized for stops of convenience other than fuel.

(3) Uniform wear is prohibited for all travel in non-tactical vehicles between MKAB, Romania and NSTA, Bulgaria.

(4) Uniform wear is prohibited for all commercial air travel and movement to and from or in commercial terminals of long distance travel.

(5) Uniform wear is permitted when representing the U.S. Military at an official Host Nation (HN) function is authorized.

(6) Wear of the Army Physical Fitness Uniform (APFU) is prohibited for off-post physical fitness.

(7) All other Army uniform wear off-post for travel, official or unofficial, is prohibited.

b. The Garrison Commander is the approval authority of all off-post events with 1-299 DoD personnel in uniform. Off-post events with DoD personnel in uniform require formal approval by the Garrison Commander using the Special Event Threat Assessment (SETA). All SETA requests will be routed through the ASA-BS Antiterrorism Officer (see paragraph 9).

c. All personnel must report targeted harassment due to the wear of the Army uniform to their Command, the MP desk, or the Black Sea Field Office (66<sup>th</sup> Counterintelligence).


5. Responsibility. All tenant leaders will ensure that Service Members strictly adhere to this policy. Military personnel conducting activities in any uniform authorized under this policy will do so with the highest degree of professionalism, courtesy and will strictly comply with military regulations and Host Nation laws. Personnel are reminded that their behavior can have strategic consequences for our mission. Every Service Member must constantly assess their surroundings and apply sound, mature judgement in all situations.

6. Violations. The provisions of paragraph 4 are punitive and offenders may be punished under the Uniform Code of Military Justice, Article 92.

7. Delegation. Tenant unit Commanders may impose additional limitations if necessary for the maintenance of good order and discipline. Any further limitations will be reported to the ASA-BS Antiterrorism Officer no later than 48 hours after Commander action.

8. Effective Date. This policy is effective immediately and will remain in effect until suspended, revoked, or superseded.
