SUBJECT: Abandonment and Towing of Motor Vehicles on Fort Bliss, Texas

2. PURPOSE: To establish and provide guidelines to the Fort Bliss Community and Units about the policies, procedures, and guidelines to report, fix, or remove vehicles that have received a DD Form 2504, Abandoned Vehicle Notice.

3. APPLICABLITY: To all personnel that live, work, and utilize Fort Bliss roadways and parking lots.

4. Abandoned Vehicles:

a. Abandoned vehicles are classified as vehicles that:

(1) Have remained in the same place for an extended period of time without being removed.

(2) Are non-operational or disabled (do not have the capability or capacity of being driven or have an appearance of being non-operational).

(3) Have expired state registration, expired insurance, do not have license plates, or possess fictitious plates.
