



TAX PREPARATION FAQS

Where is the Fort Bliss Tax Center located?

Building 2910 Cassidy Road (next to Stout track)

What do I need to bring?

- Military ID
- Social security cards (or copies) for the taxpayer and all dependents
- All tax forms (W-2s, 1099s, etc.)
- Bank account information for direct deposit refunds
- Information to support all deductions and credits
- Records of money paid to daycare providers and the providers' tax ID number
- Last year's tax return
- Deployment orders, for those who wish to take advantage of the Combat Zone Tax Exclusion (CZTE)

NOTE: Married couples filing jointly must both be present, unless the absent spouse provides a power of attorney.

When will the Fort Bliss Tax Center be open?

The Fort Bliss Tax Center will open its doors on Tuesday, January 20, 2021, and operate Monday-Friday from 9am-6pm and 10am-3pm on Saturdays & DONSA's. The location will be open during lunch. You will be able to drop off your return. The Fort Bliss will be taking appointment only. We will not be accepting walk-ins appointments at this time.

Who is eligible for tax preparation services at the Fort Bliss Tax Center?

Active-duty service members and their dependents, reservists on active-duty for at least 30 days and their dependents, and retirees and their dependents.

How do I schedule an appointment with the Fort Bliss Tax Center?
