ABOUT THE ABCMR

The mission of the Army Board for Correction of Military Records is to correct errors or remove injustices from Army military records. The ABCMR is the highest level of administrative review within the Department of Army and may only correct records after all other administrative recourse/appeal processes are exhausted. Appeals must be made within three years of the discovery of the alleged error or injustice.

WHAT TO INCLUDE WITH YOUR APPLICATION:

- Copies of all relevant military records in your possession.
- Any evidence to support your request.
 - Include copies of any correspondence you have had with other agencies to resolve your issue. The ABCMR can only address issues after all other administrative recourse/appeals available are exhausted.
- Do not send original records to the ABCMR.
