

# FORT BLISS **COVID-19 MITIGATION** REQUIREMENTS



# What you should know

While we transition from Work Safe Live Safe, we will continue to observe DoD guidance. Continued vigilance and mitigation efforts can protect the Fort Bliss community from the spread of COVID-19 and other seasonal illnesses. Effective mask wear, when necessary, and the COVID-19 Booster are important means to protect the health and readiness of our community. Fort Bliss' mitigation efforts will be based on the installation's Health Protection Condition Level.

Adjustable based on CDC's COVID Community Levels and installation Health Protection Condition Level.

# **HPCON** Level

The senior mission commander will change or maintain the HPCON status based on expert advice, while taking into consideration the CDC's COVID-19 Community Level for El Paso, Texas.

# AT HPCON C & D

Change of Commands, hail and farewells, unit balls, Torch Week, and other community events will need the FORSCOM Commander's approval unless curtailed to below 50 personnel.

# **COVID-19** Positive?

Follow the DoD guidelines. Stay home for 5 days. After 5 days, wear a mask around others for an additional 5 days.
