Withdrawal before end of school year: this is a campus decision

- Grades 1-8 Any student in grades 1-8 who moves from the District during the last two weeks of the school year may receive a regular promotion if the student's grades/attendance rates are such as to merit promotion.
- · Grades 9-12 Any student in grades 9-12 who moves from the District during the last two weeks of any semester may be awarded credit for those courses in which the student has a passing average at the time of withdrawal.
