USAAAS FY26 Course Schedule

The United States Army Advanced Airborne School conducts a variety of courses throughout the year to enable individual and unit readiness. Dates are published for the fiscal year, although, operational needs of the Corps/Division, un-forecasted DONSAAs, and weather-related events can cause dates to be moved, rescheduled or cancelled, with little notice. For the most current information contact the school prior to the scheduled date of training or review the page.

JUMPMASER WHITE SLIP REQUIREMENTS

Jumpmaster white slip candidates must be in the rank of **E-5 or above**. Personnel who are attending white slip will arrive at the mock doors at **PAX SHED 1** (Bldg# W-1335) NLT **0900**. Paratroopers **MUST bring their own equipment (ONLY MOLLE 4K IS ALLOWED)**.

JUMPMASER COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Required Equipment for Jumpmaster Course:

1. Individuals attending this training must have the following:
 - a. Valid CAC
 - b. ID tags
 - c. Serviceable ACU or authorized service uniform
 - d. Coyote brown T-Shirt (plain standard-issue t-shirts only. **(NO LOGOS)**)
 - e. Ft. Bragg East/West and Camp Mackall Maps (1:50,000 scale)
 - f. Protractor
 - g. Authorized helmet in jump configuration **without the camouflage cover and/or NVG mount**.
2. ALL these items of equipment must be approved, serviceable and properly assembled for airborne operations. If there are any questions as to the approved use of any item of equipment, please reference TC3-21.220 (Static Line Parachuting Techniques and Training), the Common Army Airborne Standing Operating Procedure CAASOP), and/or the Authorized Use List (AUL), which can be found on the USAAAS SHAREPOINT page.
3. Course Procedures and Requirements:
 - a. Course fill will occur at the mock doors of **PAX SHED 1** (Bldg# W-1335) at **0730**. Students must have valid CAC, ID tags, authorized helmet in jump configuration without the camouflage cover and/or NVG mount, student packet, and any waivers approved by AA7 if required.
 - b. Individual Requirements to attend:
 - (1) Personnel must be in the rank of **SGT / E-5** or above (**CPL / E-4 with waiver; See NOTE 1**).
 - (2) Must be a current jumper throughout the course (last qualifying jump must have taken place <180 days before the ATRRS end date of the course). **Must not be on a No Airborne Operations (ABO) profile**.
 - (3) Must have a minimum of 12 static line parachute jumps from USAF aircraft. (**Can be waived, see NOTE 1**). Personnel are **REQUIRED** to bring a copy of their **ENTIRE** DA Form 1307 Individual Jump Record.

(4) Must have been on jump status for at least 12 months (**Can be waived, see NOTE 1**).

(5) XVIII Airborne Corps personnel must have successfully completed the USAAAS Jumpmaster white slip or an 82ND ABN BDE white slip and have their original control slip.

(6) All personnel must have a student packet in accordance with the XVIII Airborne Corps schools' policy. Students should have a valid ATTRS reservation. Limited walk-on space is available.

(a) Complete DA Form 1307 (jump log) to include jumps from Airborne School.

(b) White Slip (if assigned to a unit inside of XVIII Airborne Corps).

NOTE 1 - The Deputy Commanding General - Operations (DCG-O) of the 82 Airborne Division approves all waivers for rank, number of jumps, and retainability. An example of the waiver can be obtained on the USAAAS DEPS page at the link below. This includes Paratroopers assigned outside the 82nd Airborne Division (i.e. XVIII ABN CORPS, Brigade Separates)

c. The Jumpmaster Course consists of the following:

(1) Classroom lecture/conference

(2) Practical exercises, to include:

(a) Rigging combat equipment

(b) Pre-jump training

(c) Aircraft inspection procedures

(d) Jump commands

(e) Actions in the aircraft (Jumpmaster and Safety)

(f) Jumpmaster Personnel Inspection (JMPI)

(3) Exams:

(a) Nomenclature

(b) Pre-jump

(c) JM Safety duty examination

(d) Written examination covering general subject knowledge

(e) Practical Work in the Aircraft (PWAC) (**Students must not be on a No ABO profile**)

(f) JMPI

JUMPMASTER REFRESHER (JMR) COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Required Equipment for JMR:

1. Individuals attending this training must have the following:

- a. Valid CAC
- b. ID tags
- c. Serviceable ACU or authorized service uniform
- d. Authorized helmet in jump configuration
- e. Jumpmaster Certificate and complete DA Form 1307
- f. **MUST** be a current jumper to attend JMR

2. Course Procedures and Requirements:

a. Personnel who are attending Jumpmaster Refresher course will sign-in at USAAAS starting at 0845. Training will begin at 0900.

b. Jumpmaster Refresher (JMR) training is a three (3) day course of instruction designed specifically for Command-referred Jumpmasters, Jumpmasters who have lost currency (IAW CAASOP Chapter 2. Roles, Responsibilities, Qualifications, and Currency, 2-7.c & d), Jumpmasters newly assigned or returning to the 82nd Airborne Division, and Jumpmasters who have not transitioned to the T-11 ATPS.

c. The Jumpmaster Refresher Course consists of the following:

- (1) Classroom instruction
- (2) Rigging of equipment and JMPI
- (3) Practical Work inside the Aircraft (PWAC)
- (4) All students will be tested on JMPI and Jumpmaster Duties in the Aircraft

d. The JMR Control Slip is valid for 180 days during which the Jumpmaster must conduct the required duty(ies) to maintain Jumpmaster currency. Jumpmasters who fail to perform the required duty(ies) within the 180 days must re-attend JMR.

BASIC AIRBORNE REFRESHER (BAR) REQUIREMENTS

BAR will be run by the Brigade Combat Teams (BCTs) or XVIII Airborne Corps and Corps Separates **in accordance with Annex A**. Units responsible for training will coordinate with the USAAAS Tower Committee NLT I-week prior to the execution of training.

Jumpmasters giving BAR must be BAR certified through their Brigade MJMs and certified as a Tower JM through the USAAAS Tower Committee.

Coordination for the use of the Suspended Harness Facility (SHF), 34-Foot Tower, C-1 30 Hulk,

and/or Tower JM training will be made through the Tower Committee.

The BAR Slip is valid for 60 days; Paratroopers must follow the progression IAW the CAASOP and applicable annex.

MASTER JUMPMaster (MJM) COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Required Equipment for MJM:

1. Individuals attending this training must have the following:

- a. Valid CAC
- b. ID tags
- c. Serviceable ACU or authorized service uniform
- d. Authorized helmet in jump configuration
- e. Jumpmaster Certificate and complete DA Form 1307
- f. **MUST** be a current jumper to attend JMR

2. Course Procedures and Requirements:

a. Personnel who are attending the Master Jumpmaster course will sign-in at USAAAS starting at 0845. Training will begin at 0900.

b. Individual requirements to attend:

- (1) PJ Qualified Jumpmaster
- (2) Advanced Rated (S3 Air Team personnel exempt if on additional duty orders)
- (3) Performed at least A/DZSO
- (4) Performed at least A/DACO

c. The Master Jumpmaster Course consists of the following:

- (1) Classroom instruction and hands-on training
- (2) Duties and Responsibilities of the Master Jumpmaster (MJM)
- (3) Jump Log and Jump Pay management (Division Military Pay Office)
- (4) Evaluations conducted by the MJM to include Airborne Operations, Jumpmaster Team Rehearsals, and Staff Assisted Evaluations
- (5) DZSO Duties and Responsibilities with practical exercise
- (6) Door Bundle University consisting of A-21, A-7A, and CAADS construction and exiting procedures

AIR MOVEMENT CONTROL OFFICER (AMCO) COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Required Equipment for Air Movement Control Officer Course:

1. Individuals attending this training must have the following:
 - a. Valid CAC
 - b. ID tags
 - c. Serviceable ACU or authorized service uniform
 - d. Serviceable boots IAW DA PAM 670-1
 - e. Note taking material
2. Course Procedures and Requirements:
 - a. Personnel who are attending the AMCO Course will sign-in beginning at 0900 at PAX Shed 1 (Bldg# W-1335).
 - b. Individual Requirements to attend:
 - (1) Personnel must be in the rank of SGT / E-5 or above
OR
 - (2) Personnel of any rank with a PMOS 88N
 - (3) Students must log in to <http://golearn.adls.af.mil> and complete the Equipment Preparation Introductory Course (EPIC). The student will have until the morning of day 5 of the course to turn the certificate into AMCO cadre for filing. If the student fails to produce the certificate on the morning of day 5, they will be dropped from the course.
 - c. The Air Movement Control Officer Course consists of the following:
 - (1) Three (3) separate certifications
 - (a) Transportation of Hazardous Materials by Military Air (TM 38-250 CHAPTER 3 MOVES ONLY)
 - (b) Equipment Preparation Course (EPC)
 - (c) AMC Airlift Load Planners Course (incl. I CODES technical certification)

AIR MOVEMENT CONTROL OFFICER (AMCO) REFRESHER COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Required Equipment for Air Movement Control Officer Course:

1. Individuals attending this training must have the following:
 - a. Valid CAC
 - b. ID tags
 - c. Serviceable ACU or authorized service uniform
 - d. Serviceable boots IAW DA PAM 670-1
 - e. Note taking material
 - f. AMCO Certificate, AMC-9 Card, and HAZMAT Card
 - g. **MUST** be a current AMCO to attend refresher

2. Course Procedures and Requirements:

a. Personnel who are attending the AMCO Refresher Course will sign-in beginning at 0900 at PAX Shed 1 (Bldg# W-1335).

b. Air Movement Control Officer Refresher Course training is a two (2) day course of instruction designed specifically for Air Movement Control Officers who are still current (within 24 months of their original AMCO graduation date).

c. Individual Requirements to attend:

(1) Personnel must have graduated from an Air Movement Control Officer (AMCO) Course within 24 months of the date they attend the refresher course. If an individual exceeds a period of more than 24 months without attending a refresher course, their certification is expired, and they MUST attend the AMCO course again in its entirety.

(2) Students must log into <http://golearn.adls.af.mil> to renew their EPIC certification and turn in their certificate during in-processing of the refresher course. If the student fails to produce the updated certificate on the morning of in-processing, they will be denied entry to the refresher course.

d. The Air Movement Control Officer Refresher Course consists of the following:

(1) Classroom instruction and testing

(a) Day 1: HAZMAT

(b) Day 2: Joint Air Load Planning (JALP)
