TC 8-800

TC 8-800 (TC8) Course Description

- The 8–9-day MEDIC Table Training has an emphasis on Tactical Combat Casualty Care (TC3) as well as EMT-Basic Refresher training. All 68W Soldiers are required to complete Training Tables I-VII and Table VIII Validation annually as outlined in TC 8-800. Completing Tables I-VII provides the 68W with 48 hours of CEU's toward their NREMT re-registration. Completion of Table VIII Validation meets the verification of skills competence. The Medic Assessment Validation portion of the validation process provides information an internal evaluation of a unit's individual medic's ability to drive battalion and brigade medical training plans. It assesses each medic's abilities and capabilities for applications, both garrison and deployed. Unit standards may exceed those set forth in the TC 8-800. Therefore, the DMAV will supplement the skills trained within in the TC 8-800 and will be carried out in three phases.
- 1. Pre-assessment: Soldier medic conducts Tables I-VII at the FL-MSTC with a combination of lecture and practical exercises.
- Assessment: While at the FB-MSTC the Soldier medic will be assessed during Table VIII by completing challenging multi-trauma, and medical patient lane scenarios verifying 68W skills.
- 3. Post-assessment: Each Soldier medic is counseled, and his allowed scope of practice is determined by the unit's provider. Remedial or corrective training is conducted if necessary.

Table VIII Validation

Table VIII Assessment Validation (DMAV) Course Description

- The Table VIII Validation is an annual requirement for all 68W's. The skills of the Soldier medic are perishable and must be sustained. Many junior level 68W duty positions do not allow opportunities for medics to practice the skills needed to maintain reliability and relevance. The Table VIII Validation augments the unit training of Soldier medics of the seven training tables with associated Training Support Packages (TSP).
- The tasks found in Tables I through VII are trained to standard by a qualified 68W NCO, 18D Special Forces Sergeant, a W1 Special Operations Combat Medic, or Medical Officer, documented by a Medical Officer and placed into the Medical Operational Data System (MODS) by qualified personnel. When accomplished, Soldier medics meet The CE and biennial refresher course requirements for EMT recertification. As previously stated, CE hours are awarded for completion of the training in Tables I through VII, not simply completing the testing in Table VIII. If a 68W NCO or Medical Officer is not assigned, the documentation is forwarded to the next higher medical authority for validation of training.
- The training found within the Table VIII Validation includes a skills validation table. Tables one through seven can be conducted at the unit during normal unit training cycle. Table eight testing can be conducted at the Fort Liberty Medical Simulation Training Center (MSTC) using DMAV.
- The Medic Assessment Validation portion of the validation process provides information an internal evaluation of a unit's individual medic's ability to drive battalion and brigade medical training plans. It assesses each medic's abilities and capabilities for applications, both garrison and deployed. Unit standards may exceed those set forth in the TC 8-800.

**Tables 1-7 must be completed and entered in MODS prior to attending Table 8 validation. Tables 1-7 must be completed within 12 months of Table 8 validation.

Basic Life Support (Health Care Provider)

In this course you will learn the skills of CPR for victims of all ages and will practice CPR in a team setting. You will learn how to use an automated external defibrillator (AED) and how to relieve choking (foreign-body airway obstruction). The skills you learn in this course will enable you to recognize emergencies such as sudden cardiac arrest and know how to respond to them.

The 3.5 hour Basic Life Support course is in accordance with curriculum from the American Red Cross (ARC) as well as the Military Training Network (MTN). The MTN is an authorized provider of American Red Cross Courses FOR all Military and DOD GS Civilians. The course will consist of about 3 hours of both didactic training as well as hands on training. The student will take a written exam following the didactic portion of the course as well as a hands-on exam. Following the successful completion of this course, the students will receive a BLS certification from the ARC/MTN, which is good for two (2) years.

Following the successful completion of this course, the Soldier will receive a CPR AED BLS certification from the ARC/MTN, which is good for two (2) years.

Combat Life Saver / TCCC (Tier 2)

Combat Life Saver/TCCC (Tier 2)

The 4 day Combat Lifesaver Course consists of in-residence didactic, psychomotor skills, a course comprehensive written exam, psychomotor skills assessments, and simulation labs. The course was developed by the U.S. Army to train non-medical combatants in providing far forward tactical combat casualty care to personnel in austere environments. The Combat Lifesaver Course is not designed to be a combat medic or health care provider force multiplier; its graduates are adjuncts to enhance the U.S. Army's Medical Corp's capabilities to reduce loss of life.

Course Prerequisites:

- No profile and NO appointments/ Jumps allowed during the course, Class starts at 0745 hours.
- Each unit is allowed to request up to three slots per class.
