DOMESTIC VIOLENCE/INTIMATE PARTNER ABUSE REPORTING OPTIONS

- RESTRICTED REPORTING OPTION (no law enforcement investigation) call FAP Social Worker or/and FAP MGR./Victim Advocate
- UNRESTRICTED REPORTING OPTION (law enforcement investigation) call the Fort Buchanan Police, FAP Social Worker, and FAP MGR./Victim Advocate

Army Family Action Plan (AFAP)



- □ AFAP is a program the Army have in place to ensure that standards of living in the Army keep pace with changing times
- □ AFAP gives Soldiers, retirees, DA Civilians, and Family members the opportunity to voice concerns and provide recommendations in areas that need improvement
