Services are provided for all I.D. cardholders eligible to receive military medical services to include family members and retirees.

Services Provided

The ASAP provides drug and alcohol use/abuse prevention education & awareness and bio-chemical testing services. ASAP is the POC for the Employee Assistance Program (EAP), whose services are provide through the Federal Occupational Health (FOH) and for Suicide Prevention. Commanders and supervisors who use the ASAP as a manpower conservation and human resource management tool can expect an exceptional, nationally accredited service that will enhance unit and organizational readiness and morale.

Procedures

There are several types of referral

 Self: Military or civilian individuals who feel they may have a substance abuse problem may refer themselves to the ASAP at any time.

- Command: Commanders will refer individuals to the ASAP for screening/referral for suspected substance abuse.
- Medical: Medical Treatment Facility refers individuals to the ASAP due to medical concerns of substance abuse or alcohol involvement in family advocacy cases.
- Biochemical: Any service member who receives a positive urinalysis must be referred to the ASAP, IAW AR-600-85.
- Apprehension/Investigation: Any service member identified on a Military Police blotter report for an alcohol or drug related incident must be referred to the ASAP, IAW AR 600 -85.

Prevention Education

Preventing the Preventable

The purpose of the prevention education program is to deter illicit substance abuse through education. The Program provides commanders, Unit Prevention Leaders (UPLs), Soldiers, DA Civilians, and Family Members the education and training necessary to make informed decisions about alcohol and other drug use. Prevention education provides Soldiers and Civilian employees with the knowledge about legal and illegal drugs and the consequence of their abuse.

Services provided

- Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Training Program (ADAPT), a 12-hour prevention education and life skills building course, which provides an opportunity to intervene with identified soldiers who have exhibited highrisk substance abuse behaviors through education and awareness activities.
- Distribute prevention education material through prevention campaigns. The 3 major annual campaigns are: Suicide Prevention Month in September, Red Ribbon Week in October and Drunk and Drugged Driving (3-D) in December.

- Professional Development Classes: Guidance for military leaders on how to identify and address substance abuse in their units.
- Other specialized presentations are designed by the PC to fit organizational needs and mission requirements.
