

What can I do on DisasterAssistance.gov?

- Look up your address to see if it's in a federally declared disaster area.
- Search for and learn about different types of assistance you may qualify for.
- Find information that can help you learn how to prepare for, respond to, and recover from the effects of a disaster.



Find Helpful Information

If you need immediate assistance, you can:

- Find resources in your community.
- Get help with immediate needs and shelters.
- Search for Disaster Recovery Centers (DRCs).
- Stay informed with disaster-related news.
- Read about our mission and background, and learn more about our partners.

Apply for Disaster Assistance

You'll need the following information to apply:

- Personal information (address, Social Security number, contact information, etc.)
- Household income
- Insurance information
- Bank account information (to deposit funds into your account)

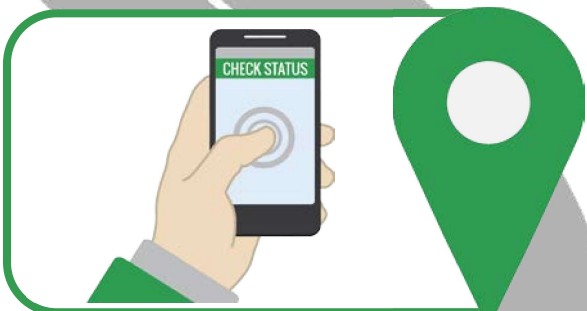
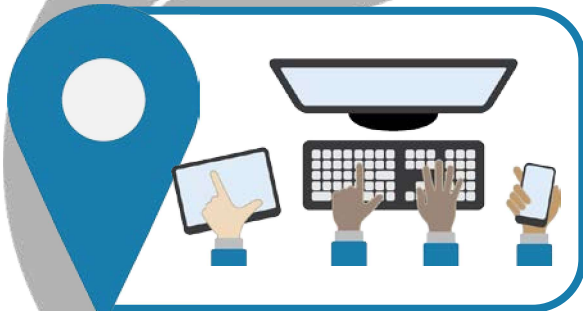
When you apply, you will be able to:

- Check the status of your application.
- Upload documents.
- Read messages about your application.
- Update your personal information.
