

## No Dig Areas & Restrictions

---

- Digging without an issued Dig Permit is prohibited.
- Military training in cemeteries is prohibited.
- Digging or construction is prohibited within 200 meters of any Drop Zone (DZ), Landing Zone (LZ) or Flight Landing Strip (FLS).
- Field latrines and/or “cat holes” are not permitted within the Fort Campbell Training Complex.
- Digging along buried communication cables is prohibited.

**If your Unit decides to dig in a different location, a new Dig Permit Request must be submitted to Range Branch Safety.**

## Environmental Protection & Laws

---

- Numerous State and Federal laws prohibit unauthorized digging on Federal property to prevent damage to archaeological sites, endangered species habitats and wetlands.
- Units must ensure compliance with all environmental laws and regulations, starting with obtaining a Dig Permit.

**Violation of these regulations could result in SUBSTANTIAL FINES and/or JAIL TIME.**

## Dig Permit Procedures for Rear Area Training Exercises

---

### Things to Remember

- A Dig Permit is required for hand and/or mechanical excavation.
- Start these procedures at least 2 weeks prior to the training exercise.
- Issued Dig Permits are valid for 15 calendar days.
- Unauthorized digging of any kind is prohibited.



## **STEP 1: Contact Range Branch Safety**

- The Unit must provide the exact location where digging activities will occur.
- If the exact location is unknown, the training requirements must be provided.
- The total area of ground disturbance for the training activity must be provided.

**Contact Range Branch Safety at least 2 weeks prior to any digging activities.**

## **STEP 2: Contact TN One Call**

- The Unit must provide the latitude and longitude coordinates for the ground disturbance.
- MGRS coordinates can be converted at <http://legallandconverter.com>.
- An approval email will be sent from TN One Call.

**Call or email TN One Call no less than 3 working days & no more than 10 working days prior to any digging activities.**

## **STEP 3: Report to Range Branch Safety**

Units must provide Range Branch Safety with the following:

- TN One call approval email.
- An area map where digging will occur.
- A risk assessment & recovery plan. If any areas need to be reseeded after digging, this must be stated in the recovery plan.
