The Armed Services Blood Program is the official blood collection, manufacturing and transfusion program for the U.S. military and the provider of blood and blood products to the U.S. armed forces. COVID-19 Testing

After the holidays, we experienced an increased demand for COVID-19 testing, increasing the time it took beneficiaries to receive an appointment for a COVID test. Offering drive thru testing without appointments helped meet the demand. Once the demand decreases, scheduling COVID testing appointments will be available again. We appreciate your patience as the increased demand resulted in longer wait times at the test site. Our care teams are working as efficiently as possible to support beneficiaries going through the test site.

In the event you require a COVID-19 test, the fastest way to check your COVID-19 test results is through the TRICARE Online Patient Portal. If you signed up to receive TRICARE text messaging or emails, you will be notified as soon as your results are entered by the lab. Simply login to TRICAREOnline.com and select the health records tab. Results are listed under the lab test name: SARS-CoV-2.

If your results are positive for COVID-19, stay home and isolate from others in your home. Wear a well-fitted mask if you must be around others in your home. Service members should notify their chain of command.

Treatment of symptoms is similar to that of other viral illnesses. Over the counter medications can aid in reducing these symptoms while awaiting a follow-up phone call from BACH staff. Patients experiencing significant shortness of breath should seek emergency care or call 911.

Prescription and Over-the-Counter Drug Disposal

Properly dispose of your expired, unused or unwanted medicine by dropping them in the Drug Drop Boxes placed inside the hospital's Main Pharmacy or Town Center Pharmacy during business hours. Accepted items include: prescription medications, controlled substance medication, over-the-counter medication, vitamins, medicated ointment/lotion, liquid medication in leak-proof containers and transdermal skin patches. *Items not accepted include: needles, thermometers, contraband drugs, infectious waste/medical waste, personal care products, business waste, hydrogen peroxide, aerosol cans, and inhalers.*
