Fort Campbell Holiday Wonderland features annual tree lighting, inaugural parade, and more

WHAT: Fort Campbell Parade, Tree Lighting Ceremony, and Holiday Wonderland

RELATED INFO: Campbell Crossing hosts Fort Campbell's inaugural [Holiday Parade](#) starting on Michigan Avenue (in the vicinity of Town Center and Wilson Theater's parking lot) and ending at the U.S. Army Garrison Fort Campbell Headquarters building, T-39 Indiana Ave., for the annual [Tree Lighting Ceremony](#) hosted by Fort Campbell Directorate of Family and Morale, Welfare and Recreation.

The parade route starts on Michigan Avenue, left on Indiana Avenue, right on 29th Street, left on Kentucky Avenue, and final left on to Screaming Eagle Boulevard and ending at the grassy area in front of T-39.

The tree lighting ceremony features musical performances by the 101st Airborne Division Band and the Child and Youth Services Choir and the arrival of Santa Claus.

Fort Campbell's Holiday Wonderland starts at 3 p.m. Dec. 6 with the [Holiday Market](#) and other fun activities at the R.F. Sink Library parking lot, 38 Screaming Eagle Blvd. (across the street from the U.S. Army Fort Campbell Garrison Headquarters). The market, featuring local artisans and food trucks, will be open until 8 p.m.

[Santa's Workshop](#) featuring arts and crafts and photos with Santa starts at 6 p.m. at the R.F. Sink Library.

The Holiday Wonderland activities continue on Saturday Dec. 7 with the [Jingle Bell Jog](#) at R.F. Sink Library and [Trees for Troops](#) at the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) Parade Field.
