101st Airborne Division (Air Assault)

On August 19, 1942 Major General William C. Lee, commander of the newly activated 101st Airborne Division, proclaimed the 101st "has no history, but it has a Rendezvous with Destiny." The Screaming Eagles first rendezvous occurred in June 1944 in Normandy, followed by Holland and then Bastogne. Screaming Eagles next found themselves in the jungles of Vietnam. The 1st Brigade (Separate) deployed in 1965 followed by the remainder of the division in 1967. The division transitioned to Airmobile in Vietnam and participated in over 15 campaigns until they returned home in 1972. When Saddam Hussein invaded Kuwait in 1991, the 101st was called on to showcase their new air assault techniques. Assaulting nearly 90 miles into enemy territory at lightning speed helped bring a swift conclusion to what was then anticipated to be a long war. When terrorists struck the US on 9/11, Soldiers from Fort Campbell immediately went into action. From 2001 – 2021, 101st units were constantly in rotation in support of the Global War on Terror in the Middle East.

1st Mobile Brigade "Bastogne"



Bastogne was first activated on August 16, 1942, as the 1st Brigade, 327th Infantry Glider Regiment. On June 6, 1944, the regiment participated in the invasion of Normandy, the largest airborne invasion in history. The regiments heroic endeavors and sacrifices at the city of Bastogne, Belgium during the Battle of the Bulge were essential to the U.S. victory during WWII. Throughout Vietnam, 1BCT participated in over 40 combat operations. In 1991, Bastogne participated in the largest helicopter air-assault mission in military history during Operation DESERT STORM. 1BCT's decorated history serves as a reminder of the sacrifices of Soldiers who have given their lives in defense of freedom around the world.

2nd Mobile Brigade "Strike"



Strike's history began with the 502nd infantry being activated in 1941. Strike's baptism in combat came on D-day, with its jump into Normandy. The 502nd served gallantly in Operation Market-Garden and in Bastogne. In 1967 Strike reconstituted as the 2nd Brigade, 101st Airborne Division, deploying to the Republic of Vietnam. Strike has since participated in Operation DESERT SHIELD, Operation DESERT STORM, Operation IRAQI FREEDOM, Operation ENDURING FREEDOM, and Operation INHERENT RESOLVE. In 2022, Strike deployed to Europe for the first time since WWII in support of Operation EUROPEAN ASSURE, DETER, and REINFORCE. Today, Strike continues to build and maintain our readiness for our next rendezvous with destiny.

3rd Mobile Brigade "Rakkasans"

The Rakkasan Brigade is the most well-known unit across the United States Army. Originally activated during World War II as the 187th Glider Infantry Regiment, the Brigade is the only one in the US Army named by its WWII enemies. The Japanese called us "Rakkasans," which roughly translates to "falling umbrella man." Today, we serve in the only Air Assault Division in the World, the 101st Airborne Division. We are disciplined, cohesive, and ready for any mission, anywhere, at any time. We've proven this during countless conflicts, including WWII, Korea, Vietnam, Desert Storm, and the Global War on Terror; to name a few. Our inspirational leaders and tenacious fighters are currently deployed across Europe to assure and reinforce NATO allies and deter Russian aggression.

101st Airborne Division Artillery "Guns of Glory"



The 101st Division Artillery (DIVARTY) has served as a part of the 101st Airborne Division (Air Assault) since the division's activation at Camp Claiborne, Louisiana, in August 1942. DIVARTY has participated in campaigns during World War II, Central Europe, and Vietnam. In 1990, DIVARTY deployed in support of Operation DESERT SHIELD and Operation DESERT STORM where we participated in the largest Air Assault Operation to date. During Operation IRAQI FREEDOM, DIVARTY coordinated over 200 close air support sorties and fired over 230 fire missions totaling over 3,600 rounds. Today, DIVARTY Soldiers continue to write the next chapter of history and stand ready for the Division's next rendezvous with destiny.

101st Airborne Division Sustainment Brigade "Lifeliners"

The 101st Sustainment Brigade traces its roots back to World War II when it was activated as the 101st Quartermaster Battalion in 1942. It provided critical logistical support during major campaigns, earning a reputation for excellence. Over the years, it evolved into the 101st Airborne Division Support Command, and in 2006, it was redesignated as the 101st Sustainment Brigade, reflecting its expanded capabilities beyond just support functions. The brigade has since served in numerous deployments, including Operation IRAQI FREEDOM and Operation ENDURING FREEDOM, showcasing our adaptability and vital role in sustaining combat and garrison operations.

101st Combat Aviation Brigade "Wings of Destiny"



The 101st Combat Aviation Brigade was constituted as the 4th AV Section on 7 Dec 1950, under the Eighth U.S. Army Korea, conducting observation and MEDEVAC operations. After redesignation, the 101st CAB deployed with the 101st Division to Vietnam from 1968-1971, playing a part in several major engagements, to include the Battle of Hamburger Hill. Later, the CAB's deep attack on 17 Jan 1991 kickstarted Operation DESERT STORM and their BDE level Air Assaults cut off the retreating Iraqi Army. The CAB deployed to Afghanistan 7 times from 2002-2018, honing its craft as the elite Air Assault unit of the US Army. The CAB remains at the forefront of Army aviation during recent deployments to EUCOM and CENTCOM.
