



4ID Pre-Ranger Reporting Information (Non-Home Station Students)



1. Arrival. All Soldiers traveling by commercial aircraft must carry a complete uniform, PT uniform and all necessary paperwork in their carry-on bag. The uniform is Army Combat Uniform, Operational Camouflage Pattern or your service equivalent. This bag will be stored in the authorized baggage area for anyone that is NOT CURRENTLY STATIONED at Fort Carson, CO, for the duration of the time the SM is in the course.

2. Travel by POV. There is a parking lot at Camp Kilo that is lighted & fenced. However, it is not locked and the 4ID Pre-Ranger is not responsible for any damages that occur to any POV while it is stored in the parking lot. Students reporting with privately owned vehicles must park them in the lot during in-processing and leave them there for the duration of the course.

3. Reporting. Incoming students will report no later than 0600 on Day 1 (Monday) of the Pre-Ranger Class they are scheduled to attend. Reporting location is the Pre-Ranger Compound (BLDG 9474). Students must report in the Army Physical Fitness Uniform (no unit attire) with all baggage and complete packet with physical. Only nametape and US Army tape will be worn on the ACU during the Pre-Ranger Course. **PRIOR TO TRAVEL IF YOU ARE III CORPS COORDINATE WITH SR. TAC SSG WASHBURN OR COURSE NCOIC. 4. Orders. Incoming students will have 5 copies of their orders assigning them to the Pre-Ranger Course. 1610's or a 4187 with unit funding code (TDY) are the Units responsibility. Students who are TDY en route must also have 5 copies of their PCS orders.

5. Meals. You must bring a BAS Recoupment Memo (template on our website) signed by you and your Commander to verify your field status for the duration of the course.

7.Elevation awareness. Personnel from other duty stations need to be aware that Fort Carson sits at 5839 ft. All personnel must be able to pass the current Ranger Physical Assessment (RPA) which consists of 49 Push-Ups, 59 Sit-Ups, 5-Mile Run in under 40 minutes, and 6 Pull-Ups (palm in).

9.Heat Mitigation Statement. If you plan on attending Pre-Ranger in the summer months, ensure that you are in peak fitness due to the extreme dryness and high temperatures.

10. Early Arrivals. 4ID Pre-Ranger Course cannot facilitate billeting for students that arrive early for the Pre-Ranger Course.

11.Clearance. No security clearance is required to attend the Pre-Ranger Course.

12.Laundry. A limited number of washers, dryers, and hand washing facilities are available at Camp Kilo. Commercial laundries may be used during off-duty time.

13. Unauthorized Items. No unauthorized items, as defined in the Ranger Packing List. Any contraband will be confiscated on Day 1. Contraband is anything not on the Ranger School Packing List.

- a. Tobacco and caffeine products of any kind are forbidden and will be grounds for immediate dismissal from the Pre-Ranger Course.
- b. Cellular phones are not authorized during the course. Cellular phones will be taken on Day 1 and returned following the completion of the course.
