Media Advisory 4ID, Fort Carson Recap for June 23-27

FORT CARSON, Colo. – It's been a busy week for the Soldiers and civilian staff at Fort Carson. Between the Division's Ivy Week festivities and the Garrison's change of responsibility, here are a few highlights from the week of June 23-27.

Ivy Week Highlights: Throughout the week, Soldiers from across the Division came together for a week's worth of dynamic and rigorous events, demonstrating Soldiers' skills, teamwork and competitive spirit.

- 1. <u>Ivy's Fittest Soldier Competition</u>: The 4th Inf. Div. hosted a three-day competition to determine the "Ivy's Fittest Soldier" as part of the Division's Ivy Week June 23-25. The competition tested participants' strength, endurance and grit while fostering Esprit de Corps and a culture of fitness within the Division. Approximately 20 Soldiers from across the installation completed the following events:
 - The 1000-pound competition: The combined weight from bench press, deadlift and squat.
 - o The Gauntlet: A timed, nine-course event comprised of running, rope climbs and weightlifting.
 - o 12-mile ruck: A timed ruck march around post complete with a 35-pound ruck sack and weapon.

Capt. Conner Salisbury, 3rd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 4th Inf. Div. and Sgt. Valeria Valdez, Headquarters and Headquarters Battalion, 4th Inf. Div., were crowned as the competition's winners.

U.S. Army Garrison Fort Carson Change of Responsibility

U.S. Army Garrison Fort Carson conducted a change of responsibility ceremony Friday morning in which Command Sgt. Maj. Jason Mortensen passed the ceremonial guidon to Command Sgt. Maj. Travis Manuel, symbolizing the transfer for responsibility from one senior enlisted leader to the next.

Manuel enlisted as a 19D Cavalry Scout in 2004 and has served in every leadership position from Team Leader to Command Sergeant Major. Before assuming responsibility for the Garrison, Manuel served as the senior enlisted leader of the 4-10 Cavalry Regiment, 3rd Armored Brigade Combat Team, 4th Infantry Division.

Mortensen assumed responsibility for the Garrison May 2023. During his time at Fort Carson, he served as the senior enlisted leader to the garrison commander, advocating for all Soldiers and Department of the Army civilians who support the installation. Upon relinquishing responsibility
