SUBJECT: United States Army Garrison (USAG) Daegu Policy Letter #21-32,
Environmental Quality Control Committee (EQCC)

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation 200-1, Environmental Protection and Enhancement, 13 December 2007.
- b. USFK Regulation 201-1, Environmental Governing Standards, 18 June 2012.

2. Applicability: This policy applies to all staff, directorates, units, tenant offices, and other organizations within USAG Daegu and Area IV.

3. Purpose: To establish Garrison-level EQCC in USAG Daegu and Area IV. The EQCC assists the USAG Commander to ensure proper management of environmental protection. The EQCC functions as an advisory body to the Garrison Commander for all aspects of environmental compliance, pollution prevention, and protection of natural and cultural resources.

4. The major functions of the EQCC are:

- a. Assess environmental compliance programs and projects covered in Environmental Governing Standards.
- b. Coordinate activities of the environmental programs and projects with tenant units, activities, and organizations.
- c. Advise the USAG Daegu Commander on environmental priorities, policies, strategies, and programs.

5. Procedure:

- a. USAG Daegu establishes an EQCC chaired by the Garrison Commander.

b. The EQCC should consist of members representing the operational, logistics, engineering, planning, resource management, legal, medical, environmental, morale, welfare, and recreation (MWR), commissary, exchange service, and safety interests of the command, including military installation tenant activities.

c. Function: The EQCC coordinates activities of various environmental programs covered in AR 200-1 and USFK Regulation 201-1. The EQCC should discuss environmental actions and activities that have transpired during the previous quarter. Environmental topics will be briefed with a plan to resolve any current issues or systemic problems which were identified from previous quarters. The Garrison Commander may direct topics of discussion for command emphasis.

d. EQCCs meet at least quarterly and the minutes are documented and filed.

6. The proponent for this policy letter is USAG Daegu Directorate or Public Works (DPW). The point of contact is the Environmental Division at 768-7594.
