CHRA Direct Hire Authority (DHA) (PL 114-328 National Defense Authorization Act): CHRA has received authority to offer hiring officials this new DHA. Positions must be a "critical hiring need" such as extraordinary workloads or unusual or unanticipated event(s) or circumstances. In these cases a non-competitive temporary appointment can be made for up to one year and may be extended an additional 6 months (may not exceed 18 months in total), or a non-competitive term initial appointment may be more than one year but may not exceed 18 months. Candidates must meet minimum qualifications, and documentation for appointments must be sufficient to allow reconstruction of actions taken. This authority would allow managers to fill their vacancies as temp or term for a period of up to 18 months without competition.

Hiring authorities will be on site to interview and take job applications. If accepted into a position most employment will start in the following two weeks. - Community members are reminded that School begins on 26 August for our local Korean community as well as our Daegu American Schools on Camps Walker and George. It is necessary to anticipate the sudden and unpredictable movements of children as they walk/run/bike or scoot to/from school alongside the roadways. Throughout Korea It is very common to see children returning home from school late at night. Children are often focused on their destination or the phone in their hand rather than those immediate hazards around them. That makes it even more important that our attention when driving is focused on our surroundings and not on the navigation system, radio, or phone. Parents are encouraged to teach their kids about street safety thru discussions, walks and most importantly by setting the example. Teach kids to use crosswalks, to put the phone away when walking and to watch out for mopeds and sudden movements of vehicles on/near sidewalks.
