SUBJECT: Snow Removal and Ice Control Plan

1. References:

a. DA Pam 420-1-3 Transportation Infrastructure and Dams, 9 April 2009

b. AR 420-1 Army Facilities Management, 12 February 2008

2. Snow Removal and Ice Control Plan, see enclosure, establishes snow removal and ice control responsibilities and procedures for USAG Daegu to include Camps Carroll, Carroll FOS, Camp Walker, Camp Henry, Camp George, Busan Storage Complex and Pier 8.

a. DPW will execute snow removal and ice control upon 1 inch (3cm) of snow accumulation in the following priority order.

(1) Airfield, primary roads and gates.

(2) Secondary roads.

(3) Parking lots and public sidewalks.

b. Each facility manager is responsible for removing snow and ice from sidewalks 50 feet away from the facilities.

c. Each facility manager can procure ice melt and snow shovels at the DPW Self Help.

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Historical Information

- Average months with snowfall in Daegu area are December through March. During January, snow falls for 2.4 days and regularly aggregates up to 11mm (0.43") of snow. Throughout the year, there are 8.6 snowfall days, and 43mm (1.69") of snow is accumulated.
- Busan is quite warmer than other parts of the country, in the winter season, the temperature can drop up to -10 degrees. Snow in Busan is rare because it is located in the least snowy region of Korea. However, one can witness light snow if lucky.
- In FY 23 DPW performed 12 snow removal and ice mitigation responses. Camp Walker = 21 Dec 22, 27 Dec 22 Camp Henry = 21 Dec 22, 27 Dec 22 Camp George = 21 Dec 22, 27 Dec 22 Camp Carroll = 21 Dec 22, 27 Dec 22 Carroll FOS = 12 times (14, 15, 17, 21, 22, 23 Dec 22), and (7, 15, 16, 27 Jan 23) & (10 Feb 23) Busan = None



Snow Removal

- Heavy Equipment is used as the primary snow removal effort.
- Dump trucks with plows and sand spreader attachments are used for roads, helicopter pads, and parking lots.
- Bobcat tractor with brush attachments are used for helicopter pads and can be utilized for light snow accumulation removal





Ice Control

- Urea is used as the primary ice control product.
- Urea is applied to roads with a sand spreader attachment.
- Urea has been approved by DPW Environmental for ice control.
- The current cost for a 20kg bag of urea is \$20.00. DPW uses approximately 100 bags of urea for each icy road response.
- DPW can apply sand for traction control at icy areas, however sand has no ice melting capabilities.





Purpose and Structure

- AR 420-1-3 Transportation Infrastructure and Dams requires the snow removal and ice control plan, which is approved by the Garrison Commander
- The purpose of this plan is to establish snow removal and ice control responsibilities and procedures for USAG Daegu to include Camps Carroll, Carroll FOS, Camp Walker, Camp Henry, Camp George, and Busan Clusters
- The plan is broken down as follows

 Trigger Points

Trigger Points

Initial alert is via DPTMS official weather reports from Air Force weather alert and commercial local weather monitoring and DES Police Reports for road conditions.

- Trigger Point 1: DPW OMD executes snow removal and ice control plan based on a projected snow accumulation of 1 inch (3cm)
- Trigger Point 2: DPW OMD will put Roads & Grounds Shop employees on stand-by duty for the evening or weekend when weather reports anticipate snow fall for the USAG Daegu area.
- Trigger Point 3: When an icy road condition is identified to DPW, crews will be dispatched to the area. When precipitation occurs during freezing temperatures icy road conditions are identified by visual observation. DES performs road condition checks in the evening and weekends, and DPW crews perform these checks during normal duty hours.





Responsibilitie

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- Facility Mangers and building occupants are responsible for snow and ice removal from sidewalks adjacent to and/or leading to their buildings and work areas, normally 50 feet away from the facilities.
- Urea, ice melt and snow shovels are available for the units or tenants at the DPW Self Help or DPW maintenance facility.
- DPW is responsible for removing snow and ice based on following priorities
 Pri 1: Airfield pavements, primary roads and gates, and long steep graded roads
 Pri 2: Secondary roads
 Pri 3: Parking lots and public sidewalks





- DPW will dispatch equipment as Priority 1
- Ice melt to support for the F.O.S. will be delivered prior to the winter season

DLA Gimcheon (APO DRMO)

• DLA staff will contact DPW work control center at 763-4824 when requesting snow removal from the site. DPW will dispatch equipment as Priority 3

Camp Walker & Carroll Airfields


Helicopter Pad Camp Walker H805 & Camp Carroll H832

- When the flying mission requirements call for immediate snow and ice removal response Airfield Operations shall notify DPW Service Call at 763-4824. DPW will then respond to the helicopter pad as a priority 1 (emergency) requirement
- When no scheduled flying mission helicopter pads area will be cleared of snow after all priority 1 roads have been cleared

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Busan Cluster Resources

Busan snow and ice control

- Historically Busan does not receive snow accumulations requiring heavy equipment support. If required Camp Walker can support snow removal efforts at Busan
- DPW has a bobcat with brush attachment for light snow removal
- DPW B2630 has 20 snow shovels, 100 sandbags and 100(20kg) bags of urea/ice melt available to issue to units
- MSC-K has 2 street sweepers and Operators at BSF that could be utilized for light snow removal (< 1inch (3cm)
- DPW, Busan will utilize one (1) Bobcat Tractor with snow brush at Pier #8
