Information for Barquist U.S. Army Health Clinic Beneficiaries

COMING TO BARQUIST MARCH 25, 2023

MHS GENESIS is the new electronic health record for the Military Health System (MHS). It integrates inpatient and outpatient electronic health records across all military hospitals and clinics worldwide. You will be able to access your health records from any military health facility from anywhere at anytime. Barquist will transition to MHS GENESIS March 25, 2023.

How does this affect your access to health care?

As we transition to the new electronic health record system, our providers and staff will need time to adjust to the new work flows, procedures, and processes. *To continue to provide you with safe, quality care during this transition, you may experience delays.*

During this time, you can expect to experience:

- Extended time with your Provider
- Increased wait times for Pharmacy services
- Reduced appointment availability
- Increased wait times for Lab & Radiology results

How will MHS GENESIS improve your overall experience?

MHS GENESIS allows you to securely access your electronic health records 24/7 and exchange messages with your military health care team *when and where it's convenient for your schedule*. It provides more efficient management of chronic, complex, and time-sensitive health conditions; provides automated, real-time clinical decision support for health care teams; and increases patient engagement capabilities that allow patients to communicate directly with providers.

- Look up high-quality, provider-approved health information related to health issues, lab results, and medications

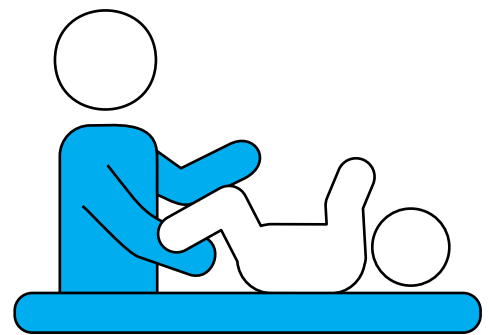

Advanced Medical Monitor (AMM)

Industry Day

March 16, 2023

The Johns Hopkins University Applied Physics Laboratory (APL), under an agreement with the US Army Medical Material Development Activity (USAMMDA), is hosting an Industry Day on Advanced Medical Monitor (AMM) capabilities. The AMM Industry Day is an opportunity for Industry to learn about the USAMMDA AMM program, funded through the Defense Health Agency (DHA), and share information about products relevant to medical monitoring with Services Users and product developers.

Focus: Advanced physiological medical monitoring products supporting the following objectives:

- Solutions which provide actionable information from point of injury (POI) through the care continuum, to – enhance casualty triage, inform treatment and evacuation priorities as well as return to duty, monitor vital signs of patients receiving medical care, and facilitate transfer of patient data through Roles of Care.
- Solutions could include monitors and/or decision support algorithms.
- All items must be ruggedized or ruggedizable to withstand forward deployed, austere military field conditions.
- Items must be products of the presenting companies, not resale items.
- Low weight, cube, power requirement and maintenance are desired.
- Cybersecurity / Risk Management Framework (RMF) / Authority to Operate (ATO) will be required.
- Product maturity must be sufficient for the Technology Maturation and Risk Reduction (TMRR) acquisition phase, with a minimum TRL of 4 (see attachment for definitions). FDA clearance / approval should be planned for completion by no later than (NLT) mid-2027. Production capability must be available by end-2027.

Format:

- Government high level summary of AMM objectives and timeline
- Industry static displays and one-on-one discussions
- Industry briefings of products and capabilities (closed sessions)

Pre-registration Requests:

- Industry representatives must request pre-registration to reserve potential for approval to participate (one submittal per company; up to two reps per company under one registration)
- Registration does NOT constitute approval to participate, however you must pre-register to retain potential for approval. Your request will be reviewed and registrants will be notified of approval/disapproval.
- Participation by any company is solely at the discretion of members of the Industry Day review committee.
- Participation by a company does not in any way constitute approval of any product by any Service organization and all companies will refrain from advertising as such.
- Note: NO contracts will result from participation in this industry day nor is participation required for any potential future solicitation.
- Government and Industry pre-registrations are done separately – see URLs at bottom of page.

- Product(s) applicability to AMM objectives, as noted under “Focus”
- Technical maturity of product(s)
- Regulatory maturity of product(s)

- Pre-registration by NLT 20 February 2023
- Approvals/disapprovals for participation by NLT 1 March 2023
- Participants list and agenda finalized and distributed to all Industry Day participants by 13 March 2023
- Set up at JHU/APL venue by 8:00am EDT, 16 March 2023
- Event concludes at 4:30pm, 16 March 2023

Military TBI: The History, Impact, and
Future

Traumatic brain injuries are known as the "signature wound" of the Global War on Terrorism. Over the last 20 years, the Department of Defense invested resources and manpower to study and treat service member TBIs, leading to the establishment of what is now the Defense Health Agency Traumatic Brain Injury Center of Excellence. Join us to hear from Megan A. Lindberg and Elisabeth M. Moy Martin of TBICoE as they take a historical approach showcasing the evolution of TBI clinical care, starting with the American Civil War and leading up to the GWOT. They will also discuss congressional mandates directing and prioritizing research efforts to result in best practices from health care providers. Museum staff members will display related collections items prior to the start of the program.

The Gains in the Education of Mathematics and Science (GEMS) program at Fort Detrick brings local students to the cutting-edge world of science for the U.S. Army Medical Research and Development Command (USAMRDC). The program is designed for current 4th through 12th grade students of all academic abilities in the 2022-2023 school calendar. GEMS promises a hands-on experience that will excite.

Engineering and Computer Science 1 (Battlebots)

Battlebots is for students who are currently in 5th-7th grade. Students will build their very own Lego robot. Throughout the week they will test their designs through activities such as a Ruck March, Parachute test and more. At the end of the week students will go head to head to see who has the strongest bot.

Engineering and Computer Science 3 (Robotics)

Robotics is for students who are currently in 9th-12th grade. Students will build, train, and code their robot. Throughout the week students will go through a series of tests that help them evaluate their robot and make adjustments to create the best robot. At the end of the week students will complete a simulated bomb removal.

Crime Scene Investigation (CSI)

Crime Scene Investigation is for students who are currently in 6th-8th grade. Students will work with a partner to determine who killed the professor. Students will have to complete fingerprinting, hair/fiber analysis, DNA isolation and more to determine the killer. At the end of the week students will review all the evidence and present who they believe the killer is and explain what they think happened.

Earth and Environmental Science

Earth and Environmental Science is for students in the 4th-5th grade. Students will learn more about their environment by performing soil and water analysis. They will learn about the ocean through a squid dissection and solar power by building a solar bug.



Intermediate Science

Intermediate Science is for students in 7th-9th grade. Students will learn about the environment through a frog dissection, biomedical by creating a circulatory system and designing a candy "pill", chemistry by launching Alka-Seltzer Rockets and more.

Engineering and Computer Science 2 (Learn Play Code)

Learn Play Code is for students currently in 6th-8th grade. Students will learn about coding by creating animated character, designing games and fixing hacked code. Students will also learn about circuits by creating a LED card, test their design skills by building a toothpick and marshmallow structure and more.



Advanced Science

Advanced Science is for students in the 9th-12th grade. Students will determine if they have the PTC gene by performing a DNA extraction and gel electrophoresis analysis. Students will perform a fetal pig dissection and learn how to suture.
