The Fort Detrick ACS will assist commanders in maintaining readiness of individuals, Families, and communities within America's military services by developing, coordinating, and delivering services that will promote self-reliance, resiliency, and stability during war and peace.

ACS offers the following services:

• Family Advocacy Program/Domestic Abuse Victim Advocate (DAVA)/FAP Educator, 301- 619-7453

- FAP is dedicated to intimate partner and child abuse prevention, education, prompt reporting, investigation, intervention and treatment.
- FAP provides a variety of services to Soldiers and Families to enhance their relationship skills and improve their quality of life. Some of the services include couples communication, anger management, individual, marital, Family counseling, parenting classes, and more.
- Provides non-clinical advocacy services and support to Soldiers and Family members who experience domestic abuse.
- DAVA's are on call 24 hours a day/7 days a week to provide crisis intervention, safety planning, non-judgmental support, assistance in securing medical treatment for injuries, information on legal rights and proceedings, and referrals to military and civilian resources.





• The on-call DAVA will empower you to make informed and independent decisions to support your recovery process.

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- The FAP educator facilitates Family Advocacy education classes or components of them. Develops and conducts psycho-education, psychosocial groups for Commanders, Soldiers and military families on mandated topics and identified needs.
- Exceptional Family Member Program (EFMP), 301-619-3385 Provides information, referral, advocacy, short-term counseling, and support services to military Families with exceptional family members/special needs. Offers respite care and a quarterly support group.
- Relocation Readiness Program/Information, Referral & Follow Up (IR&F), 301-619-6364 Supports military members and their Families during relocation with incoming and outgoing briefings, welcome packets, lending closet, newcomer's orientations, sponsorship training, and relocation guidance and counseling. IR&F links military members and Families with the most appropriate and cost effective resources in the military and civilian community.

• Survivor Outreach Services, and Mobility, Deployment and Stability and Support Operations (SSO), 301-619-6364

The SOS Program serves as the advocate for survivors by providing support, information, and services closest to where the surviving family member resides. The SOS Program embraces and reassures Survivors that they will be linked to the Army Family for as long as they desire. The Mobility, Deployment and SSO program supports Soldiers, families, commanders Army civilians prior to, during and after the deployment and mobilization process. The program provides information, referrals, training, prevention education, support systems, assistance in establishing FRG's, and assistance during the reintegration process.

- Financial Readiness Program (FRP)/Army Emergency Relief (AER), 301-619-3455 FRP offers information, counseling, and training. Training topics include; budgeting, consumer rights and responsibilities, credit, debt liquidation, insurance, and identity theft. Using established guidelines, AER assists military members, retirees, and their family members experiencing valid emergency financial situations.
- **Certified Master Resiliency Trainer, 301-619-6364** Teaches family members, civilians, and Soldiers the skills they need to grow and thrive in the face of challenges, and to bounce back from adversity. The course delves deep into





learning and implementing skills that enhance self-awareness, self-regulation, optimism, mental agility, strengths of character and connections.

• New Parent Support Program, 301-619-0323

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This program offers parents (pregnant or with children through age three) the opportunity to learn new skills and to improve old ones. Our staff knows about the concerns of parents and the challenges that only Military Families face. Home visits are the primary mode of interaction. Playgroup is held every Friday at the Fort Detrick Homes Neighborhood Center. Monthly Parenting Education classes are available.

• Employment Readiness Program, 301-619-3385

Provides comprehensive and coordinated employment programs to assist the military Families in pursuit of a career. Assists military Families with job search, individualized career counseling, and skills development through workshops and seminars.

• Army Volunteer Program, 301-619-3385

Recruits volunteers for Family, Morale, Welfare, and Recreation events, on-post and off post agencies

• Military Family Life Counselor (MFLC), 240-818-5708

Provides private and confidential non-medical, short Term, situational, problem-solving counseling services. This non-medical counseling is designed to address issues that occur across the military lifestyles and help service members and their families cope with normal reactions to the stressful/adverse situations created by deployments and reintegration.

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Share Your Voice / Know Your Limits

Public Demonstrations

For Active Duty Military

CAN

U.S. ARMY

Express your opinions and participate in peaceful non-partisan public demonstrations when OFF-DUTY and NOT in uniform

CAN'T

Engage in partisan political activity or act in a manner that could imply Army approval or disapproval of any political party, campaign or candidate in a partisan election.

Actively participate in a public demonstration that is organized by a political party, campaign or candidate

Actively participate in a public demonstration that is likely to become violent or a breach of the peace

MUST

Follow all orders and directives about specific activities that may be issued by appropriate civil and military authorities or found in the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

SHOULD

Review Department of Defense Directive 1344.10, Department of Defense Instruction 1325.06 and Army Regulation 600-20 for basic guidance concerning participation in protests and other political activities.

CAN Remember you represent the Army when you are on- or off-duty; be wise with the use of your social media accounts to express your personal views

Donate money, sign petitions and express your personal opinions when you are off-duty and not in an official capacity.

Follow, friend or like a political party or candidate running for partisan office on a personal social media account, when off-duty.

CAN'T

Post, share or link to material from a partisan political party, group or candidate, even when off duty. This restriction also applies to "Further Restricted" civilian employees, such as members of the Senior Executive Service

All Army Team members should Think, Type, Post:

Think about the message being communicated and who could potentially view it.

Type a communication that is consistent with Army Values. Post only those messages that demonstrate dignity and

respect for self and others.

For Army Civilians

CAN Express your opinions and participate in peaceful non-partisan public demonstrations, when OFF-DUTY and NOT wearing an official uniform or identifying badge."

CAN'T

Engage in a political activity in a manner that could imply Army approval or disapproval of any political party, campaign or candidate in a partisan election

MUST

Follow all orders and directives that may be issued by appropriate civil authorities.

SHOULD

Review the provisions of the Hatch Act of 1939 (5 U.S. Code Sections 7321-7326) and Office of Special Counsel guidance concerning permitted and prohibited political activities

"The rules regarding political activities for a limited class of employees, such as members of the Senior Executive Service, may be more restrictive.

Social Media

CAN

Post, share or link to material from a partisan political party, group or candidate, when off-duty and not in a government building, but not to subordinates

Friend, follow and like a political candidate when off-duty and not in a government building.

Identify a political affiliation on a personal social media profile.

CAN'T

Post partisan political articles, websites or political cartoons, memes or gifs while on-duty, in a federal building, or using a government computer, including on a personal device, during your duty hours.

Refer to your official title or position while engaged in political activity on social media.

Suggest or ask anyone to make financial contributions whether on- or offduty and whether or not using an alias.

Link to the political contribution page of any partisan group, or like, share or retweet a solicitation, including an invitation to a fundraising event.

Engage in political activity on an account that is used for official business.
