 A message from the Fort Detrick Environmental Management Office: Be careful what you dispose of down the drain

Fort Detrick maintains and operates its own wastewater treatment plant for treatment of sanitary waste (organic wastes from humans) originating from the installation. Sanitary waste generated on Fort Detrick is conveyed through a series of pipes to the plant for treatment. With this in mind, we remind residents to only flush toilet paper. Fort Detrick encourages disinfecting your environment to prevent the spread of COVID-19, however never flush disinfecting wipes or other non-flushable items. Flushing only toilet paper helps ensure that the toilets, plumbing and sanitary sewer system will continue working properly.

Also, any chemicals disposed down the drain have the potential to harm the environment. Grease and solid material can clog pipes causing sewer disruptions and overflows and should not be placed in drains. Cooking grease and oil can be disposed by placing the cooled material into a container with a re-sealable lid and chill overnight so any fat solidifies, then dispose as regular garbage.

• Tax Assistance Update

The Fort Detrick Legal Assistance Office (LAO) will assist active duty members of U.S. Armed Forces assigned to units located on or supported by Fort Detrick in preparing and electronic filing of both federal and state income tax returns for Tax Year 2020 beginning in January 2021. Members in grades O-3 and below, to include enlisted personnel and warrant officers, and their DEERS dependent spouses, are eligible for



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assistance by appointment only. The LAO will publish instructions for making appointments in the coming weeks.

COVID COACH



COVID Coach is a **free**, **easy-to-use mobile application** created for everyone, including Veterans and Servicemembers, to support self-care and overall mental health during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic. It was developed by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) in 2020. The app connects you to resources to help you cope with stress, stay healthy, stay connected, and navigate parenting, caregiving, and working at home while social distancing or sheltering in place. COVID Coach is not meant to replace processional care related to COVID-19 or mental health conditions, such as PTSD.

LEARN ABOUT COPING DURING THE PANDEMIC

COVID Coach can support you with information to help you stay balanced, connected, safe, healthy, and sane.

- Learn about healthy behaviors to protect yourself during the pandemic
- Find tips to help you with remote working, parenting, and caregiving
- Explore indoor activities to do on your own, with a partner, or with children

MANAGE SELF-CARE AND WELL-BEING

Find tools to help you manage stress during the pandemic. You can also mark the activities that are your favorites and create your own tools.

- Practice relaxation and other stress-management exercises
- Track your mood, anxiety level, well-being, and stress symptoms over time to recognize patterns and figure out what works for you
- Create your own personal support network

SET PERSONAL GOALS AND TRACK GROWTH

Creating a goal for yourself—something you can do on a daily basis to help you take care of yourself—and tracking your growth is a helpful way to focus on the positive.

- Set personal goals, small things to help yourself, a family member, or a friend
- View graphs that show your growth over time
- Set reminders to visit the app each day and work toward your goals

GET SUPPORT

If you're in crisis, use COVID Coach to connect with people who can help. There are also resources available if you just want to talk. Add contact information for people you trust and reach out when you need support.

Holiday Safety Tips

Holiday Light Safety

- Only use lights tested for safety and throw out sets with broken sockets or frayed wires.
- Fasten outdoor lights securely to trees, house, walls or other firm support to protect from wind damage.
- Turn off all lights on trees and other decorations when you go to bed or leave the house. Lights could short and start a fire.
- Never use electric lights on a metallic tree.

Decoration Safety


- Keep your fresh Christmas tree wellwatered and look for "Fire Resistant" label when buying an artificial tree.
- Place burning candles away from flammable items and blow them out before leaving the room.
- Place tree away from fireplaces, radiators and other heat sources as heated rooms dry trees out rapidly and can create fire hazards.

Toys

- Follow safety information on packages and choose toys that match your child's abilities.
- Get safety gear and ensure it is worn properly at all times and sized to fit.
- Keep small ball and toys parts away from children younger than age 3.




