SUBJECT: Garrison Policy Memorandum 21-19, Critical Information List

1. References:

- a. Army Regulation 530-1, Operations Security (OPSEC), 26 September 2014.
- b. Fort Drum OPLAN 19-002, Installation Operations Security, 08 April 2019.

2. Purpose: This memorandum prescribes the types of information within USAG that are sensitive and therefore will be protected. Disclosure of such information could provide our adversaries critical information to use against us.

3. Applicability. This policy applies to all Soldiers, Civilians and Contractors assigned to USAG Fort Drum.

4. Critical Information: The Garrison Commander considers the following as Critical Information, even if not classified.

a. Current / future operational activities of the Installation. Garrison support of deploying/mobilizing units to include unit strength, equipment, movement, and deployment specific dates/times. Specific information of installation exercises, operations, and emergency deployment readiness exercises (EDRE), airfield operations, and aircraft arrival/departures.

b. Communications involved with or in support of the Garrison. New systems and technology developed and implemented by Fort Drum Garrison and Network Enterprise Command (NEC). Systems and technology used by Director of Emergency Services and dispatch center. Protection of cell phone/tablet technology.

c. Specific peripheral operational data on Garrison law enforcement procedures. Number of law enforcement patrols on duty, their capabilities, to include the capabilities of the Garrison Response Platoon, and emergency response teams. Access control procedures during increased force protection.

d. Logistical Support for the Garrison. Monitoring of commercial deliveries throughout movement on installation. Ammunition and bulk fuel shipments and protection. Sustainment resources such as natural gas, water and electricity delivery.

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Chemicals/materials store and their protection level on the installation. Services and functions diminished during severe weather response or operations. CSX train schedule when it passes by the installation and the chemicals it carries.

e. Critical structures on the installation. Fort Drum's Critical facilities, Mission Essential Vulnerable Areas (MEVAs), High Risk Persons (HRPs), High Risk Targets (HRTs), and their protection measures. Continuity of Operations Plan (COOP) locations and back-up systems.
