

Commander's Risk Reduction Toolkit (CRRT)

CRRT is a web-based system that provides Commands with unit and Soldier data to assess their unit and Soldiers high-risk behaviors (HRBs) and deployability.

Commands may use this information to target installation resources and training toward high-risk areas that may arise within individual units.

CRRT objectives:

- Identification of high-risk and resilient Soldiers.
- Identify risk histories for newly assigned Soldiers.
- Refer Soldier to appropriate service providers.
- Track unit high-risk behavior trends.
- Provide accurate, standardized, timely data for Commanders.
- Track high-risk events from occurrence through final disposition and intervention

CRRT assistance:

RRP assistance includes:

- CRRT registration guidance.
- CRRT access approval for Commanders, CSMs, & 1SGs.




Unit Risk Inventory (URI) and Reintegration Unit Risk Inventory (RURI)

The RRP collects self-reported high-risk behavior data through the use of a Unit Risk Inventory and a Reintegration Unit Risk Inventory (URI and R-URI). The URI may be administered at any time and usually takes less than 20 minutes to complete. The URI and R-URI are required prior to and following operational deployments. Contact the RRP for specific requirements or to schedule a URI or R-URI.

What are Command Consults?

Command Consults are conducted quarterly at the Battalion level and serve as the primary venue for providing actionable information. Subject Matter Experts may be included within the consults to provide information to assist the commander in utilizing the appropriate installation resources. Subordinate command teams are highly encouraged to attend to maximize information dissemination.
