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
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About

Volunteer Component

- In exchange for this in-depth, career building certificate in the science and art of gardening, new Master Gardeners are required to participate in a servicelearning project.
- The project will include weekly gardening tasks and hands-on learning at the local Urban Mission Food Pantry Garden with seasoned Master Gardeners and Cooperative Extension Educators.
- If necessary an alternative learning project can be developed.

Skill sets obtained from the classroom and hands-on learning will include:

- How to identify plants, insects, and plant diseases.
- Integrated pest management principles.
- Planting and maintenance of trees, shrubs, fruit, vegetables, turfgrass, and flowers.
- Plant propagation methods.
- Maintain healthy soil.
- Landscaping principles.
- Pruning methods.
