



RECYCLING

Common household items that can go *IN* your recycle can:

Newspapers
Paper egg cartons
Cereal boxes
Milk jugs (rinsed)
Scrap metal
All paper
Soap boxes
Glass bottles and jars
Tin cans (rinsed)
Aluminum cans
Pots and pans (clean)
Metal clothing hangers
Plastic bags
Household Plastics



Customer Tips:

- Place your can at the curb by 7:00 am.
- Use the 4 ft rule: Place your cans at least 4 feet from other cans, trees, fences, cars and any other object.
- Don't overload your can. Items should not stick out above the top more than a couple of inches.
- Yard waste is not recyclable.
- Loosely bag your recyclables (a plastic shopping bag) to prevent the wind from blowing them out of the truck. Bundle your plastic bags into a "bag ball" and tie it shut.
- Remove lids from plastic bottles before putting both



Keep these items *OUT* of your recycle can:

Carpet pad
Wood
Syringes
Packing Peanuts
Appliances
Motor Oil
Food or Food Scraps
Clothing
Carpet
Hazardous Materials
Paint
Aerosols
Asbestos
Styrofoam
Insecticides
Rubber
Leaves or lawn clippings

- Empty aerosol cans
- Any item too large to fit the container
