SUBJECT: Garrison Commander's Policy Memorandum No. 14 - Recycling

1. References:

2. Purpose: To establish command policy and guidelines for recycling on Fort Eisenhower and Gillem Enclave.

3. Applicability: This policy applies to all units and activities assigned, attached, conducting training, or residing on Fort Eisenhower and Gillem enclave as tenants; contractor activities and leases located within the limits of the Fort Eisenhower military reservation; and members of Family housing. Participation in the Fort Eisenhower Recycling Program is a requirement, not an option. During mobilization, this regulation remains in effect.

4. Guidance:

- a. All entities generating recyclable materials are required to implement recycling programs with material being diverted to Fort Eisenhower Recycling. The items are addressed to USASC&FG Regulation 200-1.
- b. If paper requires shredding, only use one direction shredders. Cross-cut shredding is not necessary when combining shredding material in a baler with other large quantities of paper. Cross-cut shredded paper is not recyclable.

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c. All construction contracts should include a statement that requires the contractor to deliver all recyclable material to the Fort Eisenhower Qualified Recycling Program for first right of refusal.

5. This policy will remain in effect until superseded or rescinded.
