

U.S. Army Cyber Center of Excellence Driving Offenses Blotter July 2022

Members of the Fort Gordon Community,

Driving Under the Influence (DUI) and excessive speeding (driving 20 miles per hour over the posted speed limit) are serious offenses. I am concerned with the high number of citations for these offenses on Fort Gordon.

Excessive speeding results in an automatic six-month suspension of on-post driving privileges. DUI results in an automatic twelve-month suspension of on-post driving privileges.

All parties in the adjudication process for reinstating on-post driving privileges will weigh the facts of each case carefully, but driving on-post is a privilege, not a right. There is no guarantee that your driving privileges will be restored if you are cited for DUI or excessive speeding. Below you will find a blotter listing twenty-six citations in the month of July that cost someone their on-post driving privileges for six months or more.

Please drive sober, safely, and at or under the posted speed limit. Fort Gordon law enforcement officers will be on the roads and vigilant in enforcing the law.

On 4 July 2022, at 1838, an Airman First Class (A1C) from 451st Intelligence Squadron, Fort Gordon, GA for speeding outbound Gate 1. A1C was tracked via Radar (46MPH in a 25MPH).

On 21 July 2022, at 0615, a Staff Sergeant (SSG) from C Co, 707th MI BN, 706th MI GP, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SSG was tracked via Radar (55MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 21 July 2022, at 0801, a civilian from Daytona, FL, for speeding at 3rd Ave and Pine St. The civilian was tracked via Radar (46MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 21 July 2022, at 0644, a SSG from B Co, 369th SIG BN, 15th SIG BDE, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SSG was tracked via Radar (55MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 21 July 2022, at 0659, a SSG from D Co, 551st SIG BN, 15th SIG BDE, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SSG was tracked via Radar (52MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 21 July 2022, at 1154, a civilian from Grovetown, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (46MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 21 July 2022, at 1443, a Lieutenant Colonel (LTC) from HQ & A Co, CTB, 15th SIG BDE, for speeding outbound Gate 1. LTC was tracked via Radar (58MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 21 July 2022, at 2058, a civilian from Hephzibah, GA, for speeding at Rice Rd and North Rice Rd. The civilian was tracked via Radar (45MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 26 July 2022, at 0647, a Captain (CPT) from HHC, Dwight D. Eisenhower Army Medical Center (DDEAMC), for reckless driving and speeding outbound Gate 1. CPT was tracked via Radar (70MPH in a 25MPH zone). CPT was also found to be in possession of a loaded, unregistered handgun.

On 26 July 2022, at 1928, a civilian from Martinez, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (45MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 27 July 2022, at 0647, a civilian from Hephzibah, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (60MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 29 July 2022, at 0630, a SSG from CTB, 15th SIG BDE, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SSG was tracked via Radar (55MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 29 July 2022, at 0929, a civilian from Graniteville, SC, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (50MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 29 July 2022, at 0940, a Petty Officer 1st Class (PO1) from NIOC-GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. PO1 was tracked via Radar (47MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 29 July 2022, at 1005, a Specialist (SPC) from USAG, Fort Gordon, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SPC was tracked via Radar (54MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 29 July 2022, at 1009, a civilian from Grovetown, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (50MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 30 July 2022, at 0817, a SPC from CTB, 15th SIG BDE, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SPC was tracked via Radar (52MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 30 July 2022, at 0835, a civilian from Hephzibah, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (65MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 31 July 2022, at 0620, a civilian from Aiken, SC, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (58MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 31 July 2022, at 0709, a civilian from DDEAMC, for speeding outbound Gate 1. The civilian was tracked via Radar (47MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 31 July 2022, at 1003, a SPC from A Co, PED BN, 116th MI BDE, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SPC was tracked via Radar (54MPH in a 25MPH zone).

On 31 July 2022, at 1015, a Seaman (SN) from NIOC-GA, Fort Gordon, GA, for speeding outbound Gate 1. SN was tracked via Radar (48MPH in a 25MPH zone).

12-MONTH SUSPENSIONS

On 8 July 2022, at 0955, the Law Enforcement Center (LEC) was provided documentation from the Columbia County Sheriff's Office. On 5 June 2022, a Sheriff's Deputy cited a Staff Sergeant from C Co, 60th OCO Signal BN for driving under the influence of alcohol Columbia Road at William Few Parkway, Appling, GA. The Staff Sergeant showed signs of alcohol impairment through a Standard Field Sobriety Test (SFST), but refused to provide a breath sample. The Staff Sergeant was released to the LEC.

On 16 July 2022, at 0204, a Military Police Officer (MP) cited a civilian from Fort Gordon, GA, for driving under the influence of alcohol inbound of Gate 1. The civilian provided a breath sample of .127% Blood Alcohol Content (BAC).

On 17 July 2022, at 0220, an MP cited a Specialist from A Det, 202nd MI BN, 513th MI BDE, Fort Gordon, GA, for driving under the influence of alcohol inbound of Gate 1. The Specialist showed signs of alcohol impairment through an SFST, but refused to provide a breath sample.

On 18 July 2022, at 0242, an MP cited a Specialist from C Co, 60th OCO Signal BN, for driving under the influence of alcohol inbound of Gate 1. The Specialist was under the age of 21 and provided a breath sample of .013% BAC.
