MEMORANDUM FOR ALL SUBORDINATE COMMANDS AND TENANT UNITS

SUBJECT: Fort Hamilton Transition to Health Protection Condition (HPCON) Alpha

1. References:

- a. DOD Memorandum "Consolidated Department of Defense Coronavirus Disease 2019 Force Health Protection Guidance," 30 January 2023
- b. Fort Hamilton Mask Policy Update, 03 March 2022

2. The purpose of this memorandum is to provide detailed guidance on the Fort Hamilton transition from HPCON B to HPCON A.

3. In accordance with DOD and Army policy, and aligned with local health protection measures, Fort Hamilton will transition to HPCON A effective immediately. This transition is in response to the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) decreasing the Community Risk level in Kings County (Brooklyn) from 'High' to 'Low'.

4. Changes to protective measures include:

- a. Communicate to personnel how and when to report illness and seek care for potential influenza-like illness.
- b. Common areas and large venues (e.g., sit-down dining, movie theaters, gyms, sporting venues, and commissaries) should adhere to established cleaning and sanitation protocols.

5. The Fort Hamilton Mask Policy published 03 March 2022 remains in effect. Masks will not be required on Fort Hamilton unless the HPCON level increases.

6. Tenant organizations may implement stricter measures as they see fit, within overall DOD and Army guidance.

7. Fort Hamilton will continue to monitor the threat of COVID-19 in and around the installation to keep the community safe.
