

Learn tools to overcome anger and engage in positive ways to resolve conflict to have healthy and long-lasting relationships.


Before it manages YOU, learn tools to understand, identify and manage your stress!

MFLCs are imbedded in units or are available at ACS. They provide non-medical, short-term, solution-focused counseling for issues amenable to brief intervention. The counseling is available on a walk-in basis at ACS or appointments can be scheduled via telephone.

Army Emergency Relief – Pet Transportation Assistance

Eligibility

- ✓ Active Duty Soldiers and their eligible Family Members
- ✓ U.S. Army Reservists
- ✓ Army National Guard Soldiers on continuous Active Duty orders (Title 10, Title 32)

Coverage

- ✓ Assistance will be provided as a loan up to \$5,500. Additional assistance may be requested as an exception with Unit Chain of Command and Level II concurrence.

NOTES:

- ✓ If a Soldier has already paid for pet transportation fees through a credit card or high interest loan, retroactive reimbursement is authorized as a loan effective 01 October 2020.
- ✓ The Soldier is responsible for completing all necessary steps and covering costs to ensure the pet is prepared for travel, such as health, and specific breed requirements.

Required Documents

- ✓ Valid Military ID Card
- ✓ Application Form 101
- ✓ Current End of Month Leave and Earnings Statement (LES)
- ✓ Enlisted/Officer Record Brief (ERB/ORB)
- ✓ Budget Worksheet
- ✓ Form 575 for Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT)
- ✓ Proof of ownership through official license and veterinarian records
- ✓ Estimate of pet travel costs

Child & Youth Services Deployment Support Services



✓ ***What is Child and Youth Services Deployment Support Services?***

- It is a commitment from the Army to enhance Family readiness by providing additional support to Families, especially during deployments.

✓ ***What are the benefits for Army qualified Service Members?***

- Fee Reduction: 20% reduction to fees for regularly scheduled full-day or part-day care. Valid for 30 days prior to deployment and 90 days after returning from deployment. This support is also provided to Soldiers while assigned to a Warrior Transition Unit.
- Respite Care: Up to 16 Hours of Respite Care in Family Child Care (FCC) Homes depending on deployment length. Space is limited. Hourly Care reservations can be made up to 30 days in advance.



Tenant Informal Dispute Resolution Procedures

- ✓ The informal dispute resolution process is a measured approach intended to resolve disputes at the garrison level. The process addresses both lease disputes and disputes that fall outside the specific parameters of the lease document (i.e., personal property claims).

- ✓ Tenants are required to attempt to resolve disputes informally in order as follows:
 - Informal Dispute Resolution PROC addendum to the tenant's lease.
 - Resolve issue via your community office, call 877-487-4323.
 - If issue unresolved, contact Customer Care Manager, email customercare@IPCHawaii.com, or call 808-275-3160.
 - If issue still not adequately addressed, contact corporate office, email military@wincco.com, or call 617-239-4596.

 - Informal Dispute Resolution PROC Memo, https://home.army.mil/hawaii/index.php/download_file/4203/756
 - Contact Army Housing Office (AHO), call 808-655-7399. AHO is available to assist tenant in completing the informal dispute resolution request form for GC review and subsequent mediation.
 - If agreement is not reached, GC will conclude the informal dispute resolution phase and advise the tenant that they may file a request for formal dispute resolution.

- ✓ Formal Dispute Resolution Process:
 - Designed to obtain prompt and fair resolution of housing disputes concerning rights & responsibilities in the lease.
 - Requests will follow DoD guidance and use the forms in Schedule 3 of the universal lease and dispute resolution process.
 - Decision Authority (CG, IMCOM) may only award certain remedies as described in Schedule 3 of the universal lease.

- If you have a “buzz” you are likely physically impaired to some extent even if not at the “legal limit”





Early Return of Dependents

Applies to situations when a command sponsored dependent, who is at a PDS OCONUS, returns to a designated place at Government expense before the Service member receives official notice of a PCS from the PDS OCONUS.

Early Return of Dependents is only used for unusual/emergency circumstances like marital difficulties, financial difficulties, divorce, hardship, etc.

Reasons for Return. The return must be caused by one of the following:

- An official situation
- A matter of national interest
- A personal situation at the PDS OCONUS
- Disciplinary action is taken against a service member stationed OCONUS.



ERDs will not be authorized for the following:

- If the submitted situation does not meet any of the circumstances listed above
- To be used in lieu of a Soldiers family-care plan during deployment or temporary duty
- If the Soldier is on assignment instructions or has been officially notified of PCS
- For personal desire or conveniences or if required support documentation for justification instructions.

NOTE: Early-return is NOT authorized because a Soldier is on deployment orders.

 - January 31, 2022 > Retirees and their dependents
- The minimum age of initial ID Card issuance increased from **10** to **14** years old (Child)
- Issue CAC for Civilian and Military personnel
 - CAC transactions limited to initial issuance, lost/stolen or reissuance of CAC expiring within 30 days; **CACs will not be reissued due to information changes (e.g., promotion and name changes)**
 - Limited Walk-ins for CAC update, PIN reset and newborn enrollment.

Unauthorized Child Care Ten Hour Rule – You Can Still Be Neighborly

It's okay to be neighborly and the "ten hour rule" does not eliminate "good neighbor" favors!

Examples of occasional care that does not occur on a regular basis.

Regular basis means routinely for an extended period of time.

- You can host a sleepover in your home with your children's friends.
- You can care for your neighbors children in your home overnight as a favor while they enjoy a weekend get-away.
- You can care your friend's children while they attend an appointment.
- You can be on a Family Care Plan for a friend or family member and provide care for their children when they are called away for weekend training or temporary duty.

Unauthorized child care settings do not apply to care being provided to your children in your own home.



Home Alone

Birth to age 9: No

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 4 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 12-13: Yes, up to 6 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 14-15: Yes, but not overnight. No longer than 9 hours with ready access to adult supervision

Age 16-17: Yes, no more than two consecutive overnight periods with access to adult supervision



Unattended Outside

Birth to age 5: No

Age 6-9: Yes, if in a playground/yard w/ immediate access to adult supervision (to include being within sight and hearing distance). Children 6 years old and older are exempt from the "outside unattended" rule when walking to and from school, school bus stop, or CYs activity. Walk cannot be longer than 1 mile or cross a busy street.

Age 10-11: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in hourly. Adult must respond within 30 minutes or less to a child in crisis.

Age 12-13: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in via phone or in person every 2 hrs., must know child's location/activity, and respond within 1hr .

Age 14-15: Yes, with access to adult supervision via phone within 2 hrs. Contact made every 3 hrs. Follow curfew.

Age 16-17: Yes, follow curfew guidance.

Babysitting Siblings & Other Children

Birth to 10: No

Age 11: Yes, may only care for siblings age 6 and older. Not to exceed 3 hrs.

Age 12-13: Up to 6 hrs. with access to adult.

Children must be age 2 and older.

Age 14-15: Up to 9 hrs. (not overnight) with access to adult. Non-siblings must be age 2 and older

Age 16-17: Yes

Unattended In Car

Birth to age 6): No

Age 7-9: Yes, up to 10 minutes if the keys have been removed and hand brake applied

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 20 minutes, keys removed and handbrake applied

Age 12-17: Yes

- Reassignments Office provides S1's and SGM/CSMs a Missing Documents log weekly.
- It is Army policy that if an individual has a government travel card, it will be used for all relocation expenses up to the limit of their entitlements. A centrally billed account is only available for Soldiers who do not have a government travel card. Account type must be indicated to Reassignments Office prior to orders being cut.

DHR - Family Travel Office

Due to the COVID travel restrictions, the process to request orders for all Government Funded Travel now requires additional steps. (Early Return of Dependent, Dependent Travel, Space A Travel and Student Travel.)

All Government Funded Travel requests are processed as follows:

1. Service Member submits the packet to their Chain of Command (packet checklists provided on the Garrison Webpage)
2. Chain of Command submits the packet to Schofield Family Travel Section Military-Personnel Division (SFTS-MPD)
3. After tentatively approving the request for travel, the SFTS-MPD provides the S-1 a Memorandum to be used as a justification to request a Travel Exception to Policy (ETP) signed by the first General Officer in the Chain of Command.
4. Chain of Command submits the signed ETP to SFTS-MPD
5. SFTS-MPD then provides the final order to S-1 and Service Member

Transportation and Carlson Wagon-lit (SATO) will require a copy of the final orders and signed Travel ETP to book HHG shipments and flights
