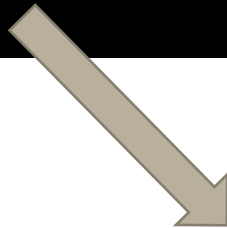

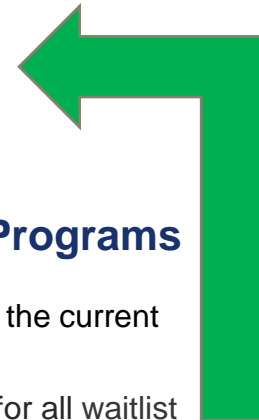

Policy Change Concerning Priorities for Department of Defense Child Care Programs

The policy, [signed Feb 21, 2020](#), by [Secretary of Defense Mark Esper](#), will implement a policy change to the current priorities for child care.

The DoD's waitlist management system, [MilitaryChildCare.com](#), will continue to serve as the access point for all waitlist requests. [Implementation of these changes is effective beginning September 1, 2020](#); the Washington Headquarters Services Directives Division will update the current version online.

What can you expect? New priorities with potential displacement of lower priority categories (45 day notice)

Child Supervision & Babysitting:

Home Alone

Birth to age 9: No

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 4 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 12-13: Yes, up to 6 hrs. in a 24-hr period (not overnight) w/access to adult

Age 14-15: Yes, but not overnight. No longer than 9 hours with ready access to adult supervision

Age 16-17: Yes, no more than two consecutive overnight periods with access to adult supervision



Unattended Outside

Birth to age 5: No

Age 6-9: Yes, if in a playground/yard w/ immediate access to adult supervision (to include being within sight and hearing distance). Children 6 years old and older are exempt from the "outside unattended" rule when walking to and from school, school bus stop, or CYS activity. Walk cannot be longer than 1 mile or cross a busy street.

Age 10-11: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in hourly. Adult must respond within 30 minutes or less to a child in crisis.

Age 12-13: Yes, with ready access to adult supervision. Sponsors checks on child or child checks in via phone or in person every 2 hrs., must know child's location/activity, and respond within 1hr .

Age 14-15: Yes, with access to adult supervision via phone within 2 hrs. Contact made every 3 hrs. Follow curfew.

Age 16-17: Yes, follow curfew guidance.

Babysitting Siblings & Other Children

Birth to 10: No

Age 11: Yes, may only care for siblings age 6 and older. Not to exceed 3 hrs.

Age 12-13: Up to 6 hrs. with access to adult.

Children must be age 2 and older.

Age 14-15: Up to 9 hrs. (not overnight) with access to adult. Non-siblings must be age 2 and older

Age 16-17: Yes

Unattended In Car

Birth to age 6): No

Age 7-9: Yes, up to 10 minutes if the keys have been removed and hand brake applied

Age 10-11: Yes, up to 20 minutes, keys removed and handbrake applied

Age 12-17: Yes

2020 U.S. Census

✓ U.S. Census Bureau has initiated a phased restart of the 2020 Census collection for Hawaii.

- Census Takers Are Following Up with Nonresponding Households.
 - Starting in July, census takers are visiting homes that have not respond to the 2020 Census.
 - Scheduled through 30 September.

✓ What To Expect

- Census takers will wear masks and follow local public health guidelines when visiting your home. All census takers complete COVID-19 training on social distancing and other health and safety protocols before beginning work in neighborhoods.
- Census takers work between 9am and 9pm, including weekends. If no one is home when the census taker visits, the census taker will leave a notice of their visit with information about how to respond online, by phone or by mail.
- Census personnel carry ID cards with a picture.

Refuse Collection and Recycling

✓ PCS Season Quick Reminder

- Refuse and recycling collections and bulk pick-up is provided to residents weekly.
- Residents are notified of scheduled refuse and recycling pick-up days at the time of move-in by community center staff.
- Bulk pick-up includes items such as furniture or other large items.
- Bulk pick-up will not include appliances or other mechanical assemblies that contain oils or other fluids.
- Hazardous waste will not be picked up by the refuse collection company.
- Residents must take items such as air conditioners, batteries and propane tanks to an appropriate disposal site.

Back-to-School Safety

- **Bike Safety.** Helmets are required at all times when riding all wheeled equipment (i.e. scooters, skateboards, roller blades, hover boards, etc.) in USAG-HI.
- **Child Supervision.** Children under the age of 7 cannot be left unsupervised at bus stops, public facilities, residences, in vehicles or recreational areas, and cannot walk to and from school or bus stops alone.
- **Stopped School Buses.** Do not pass school busses when they are loading / unloading children.
- **Crossing Guards.** Watch out for children on their way to / from school and obey the directions of crossing guards.
- **Police Presence.** There will be additional police presence at and around schools for the safety of our community.

Vehicle Break-ins/Vehicle Thefts

The United States Army Garrison Hawaii has seen a spike in stolen privately owned vehicles and motorcycles. The vast majority of these stolen vehicles have been taken during the hours of darkness and many have been unlocked or unsecured while some even had keys in the vehicles.

Crime Prevention Tips

- Never leave your vehicle unsecured and unattended
- Don't leave any valuable items visible in your vehicle
- Don't store military issued equipment in your vehicle
- Secured motorcycles in a closed garaged or with a chain to a fixed point
- Use motorcycle handlebar locks
- Don't leave motorcycle helmets or PPE unsecure

Speeding

An increase in speeding on USAG-HI installations is creating a safety hazard to pedestrians, children, and Soldiers conducting physical training.

As a result, Operation Slow Down (Speed Limit on Schofield Barracks from 6:30 a.m. – 8 a.m., Monday – Friday, is 15 MPH) went into effect on 1 June.

- **739** violations of Operation Slow Down (OSD) since 01 June
 - **78%** Service Members
 - **11%** Family Members
 - **11%** Civilians



With the 15 MPH speed limit, school buses stopping to pick up children, and children walking to school, there will be more traffic congestion on the installations – please allow additional time to reach your destination.

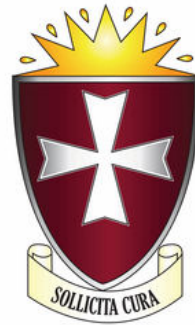
Schofield Barracks DEERS ID Office

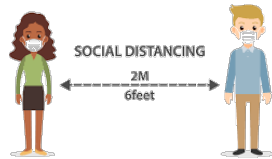

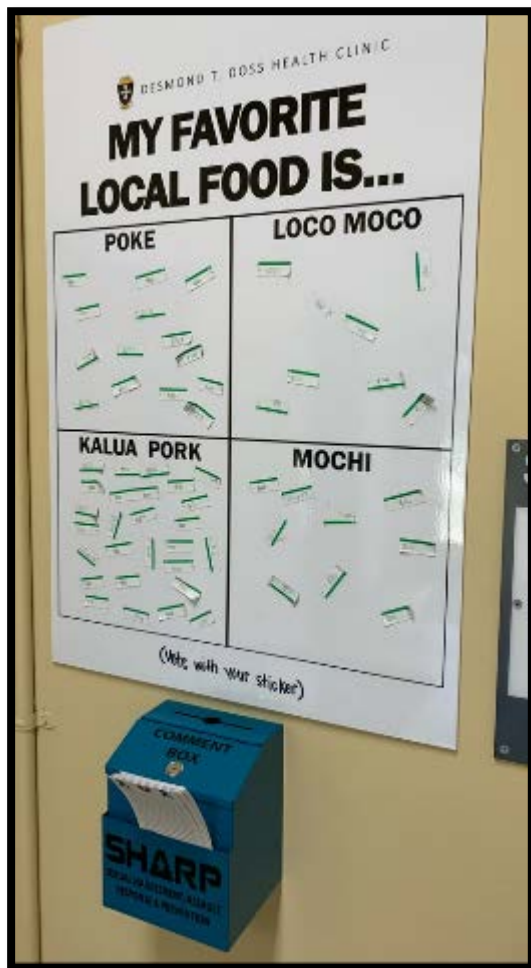

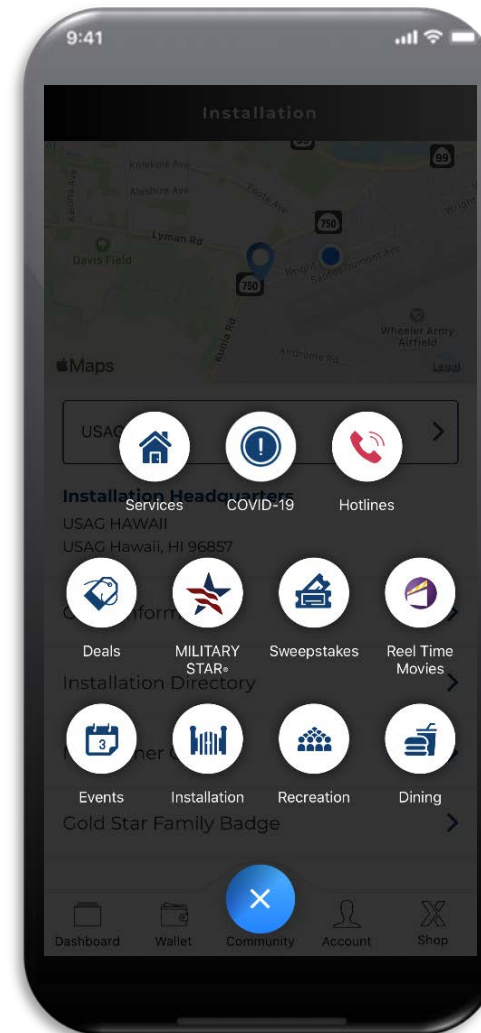
