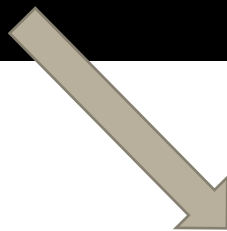

3. Supporting the Army Fee Assistance Process

Army Fee Assistance = Financial Subsidy for Off Installation Care

Army families can receive fee assistance to offset the cost of care in their communities.

Who is eligible:

Army families with a spouse who is working a minimum of 16 hours a week or who is enrolled in school.

When CY5 cannot provide care within 30 days of the date care is required a statement of non-availability is provided so that families can apply for fee assistance.

U.S. Army Garrison Hawaii is in the planning stages for two additional large Child Development Centers with 336 spaces:



- Child Development Centers notify the Parent Central Services Office of upcoming vacancies after the parents provide notification of withdrawal. Parents of current enrollees are provided discount incentives for providing 30 days notice so that we can project when spaces will become open.
- Parent Central Services reviews the waitlist daily and offers spaces available based on the category of priority placement.

Ten Hour Rule – You Can Still Be Neighborly

The ten child care hour limit identified in Army Regulation 608-10 is a baseline for regulatory oversight frequently used by State, county, and other comparable licensing agencies.

The Department of Army only oversees child care on Army installations.

- ✓ You can ensure that your child is in a certified Army home by always:
 - ✓ Registering on militarychildcare.com
 - ✓ Getting your childcare referral from Parent Central Services
- ✓ Looking for the U.S. Army Family Child Care decal at your care provider's home



It's okay to be neighborly and the “ten hour rule” does not eliminate “good neighbor” favors!

Examples of occasional care that does not occur on a regular basis.

Regular basis means routinely for an extended period of time.

- ✓ You can host a sleepover in your home with your children's friends.
- ✓ You can care for your neighbors children in your home overnight as a favor while they enjoy a weekend get-away.
- ✓ You can care for your friend's children while they attend an appointment.
- ✓ You can be on a Family Care Plan for a friend or family member and provide care for their children when they are called away for weekend training or temporary duty.

Unauthorized child care settings do not apply to care being provided to your children in your own home.

Important Changes for Home Based Businesses!



IMCOM Policy Memo 215-1-14 identifies changes for Home-Based Businesses!

A recent Department of Army Directive identified that Home-Based Businesses ARE NOT normally in competition with installation sanctioned commerce (AAFES, MWR, etc.)

If your request was previously denied on this basis, please reapply!

✓ Home based businesses are still required to comply with and are subject to inspection by the appropriate city, county, state or federal agency, office or department for compliance with applicable laws, codes, regulations and requirements.

✓ The change DOES NOT pertain to on-post home childcare. Personnel desiring to provide childcare must register with Child and Youth School Services (CYS) as part of the Family Child Care (FCC) provider system.

Local policies are being updated to reflect additional changes in coordination with Island Palm Communities.



Changes will address:

- Simplified application Process
- Customer visiting hours and parking limitations
 - Limits to use of home space
 - House signage criteria

Bicycle Safety Awareness

Before using your bicycle, make sure it is ready to ride. You should always inspect your bike to make sure all parts are secure and working properly. Remember to:

- Wear a Properly Fitted Bicycle Helmet
- Control Your Bicycle
- Adjust Your Bicycle to Fit



- Check Your Equipment
- See and Be Seen
- Watch For and Avoid Road Hazards
- Avoid Riding at Night

Must wear protective equipment for all wheeled equipment (i.e. scooters, skateboards, roller blades, hover boards, etc.)

Alternate Ways to Dispose of Unwanted Vehicles

- Donate your vehicle (charitable, tax-deduction, most charities will pick up the vehicle)
- Use the USAG HI Privately Owned Vehicle (POV) Resale Lot



Proper Procedures to Sell Your Vehicle

- In Hawaii, vehicle owners must complete and submit a Notice of Transfer form when selling to a private party within 10 days of the transfer or sale.
- If you sell your car but do not file a completed **Notice of Transfer** with the Motor Vehicle, Licensing & Permits Division, you may be held financially responsible for fees, fines, and even accidents that occur after the sale.





Emergency Services

Disabling Smoke Detectors

According the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) 2019:

- Smoking materials caused 5% of reported home fires, 21% of home fatalities, 10% of home fire injuries, and 6% of the direct property damage to the home.
- **Smoke Detectors are a primary defense** against unwanted fires caused by smoking material!
