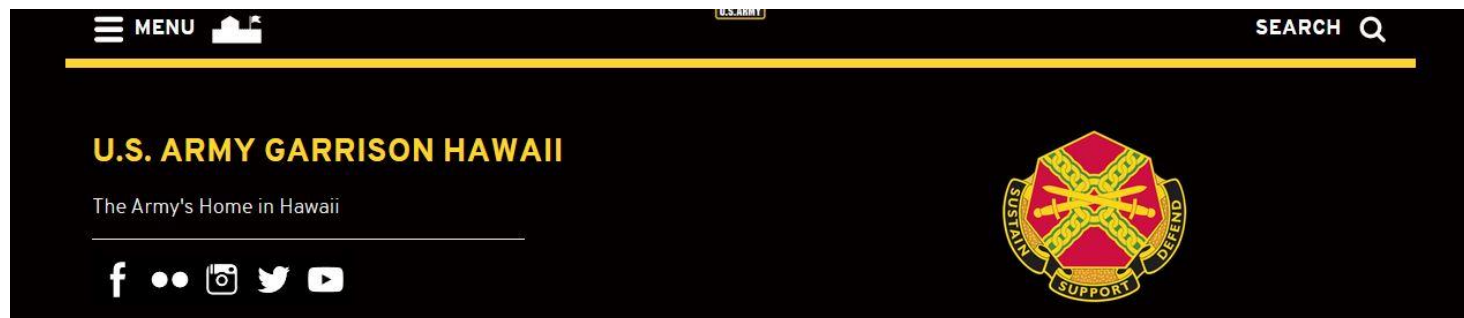

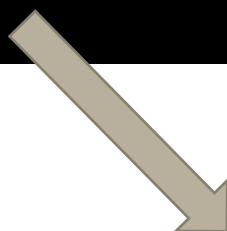

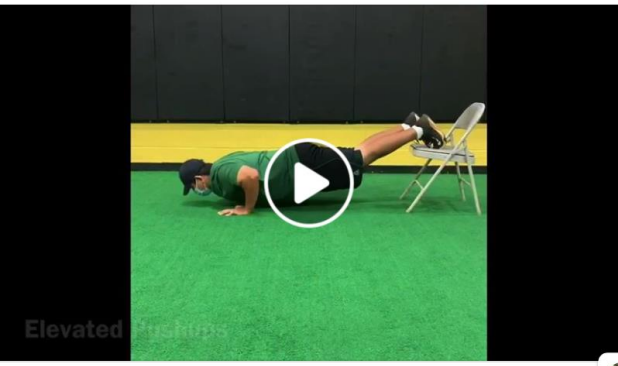

Temporary Changes for Home Based Businesses!

IMCOM Policy Memo 215-1-14 identifies changes for Home-Based Businesses!



A recent Department of Army Directive identified that Home-Based Businesses ARE NOT normally in competition with installation sanctioned commerce (AAFES, MWR, etc.)

If your request was previously denied on this basis, please reapply!

- ✓ **Home based businesses are still required to comply with and are subject to inspection by the appropriate city, county, state or federal agency, office or department for compliance with applicable laws, codes, regulations and requirements.**
- ✓ **The change DOES NOT pertain to on-post home childcare. Personnel desiring to provide childcare must register with Child and Youth School Services (CYS) as part of the Family Child Care (FCC) provider system.**

Local policies are being updated to reflect additional changes after coordination with Island Palm Communities.



Changes will address:

- Application Process
- Customer visiting hours and parking limitations
- Limits to use of home space
- House signage criteria

- ✓ School bus refunds for the 4th quarter will be processed and mailed to the address on file. For coupon refunds, please return unused coupons to your child's school to initiate a refund.
- ✓ The Hawaii Department of Education is still developing plans for next school year.
- ✓ Many administrative offices have part-time hours or open by appointments only to process school registration, transfers and withdrawals.

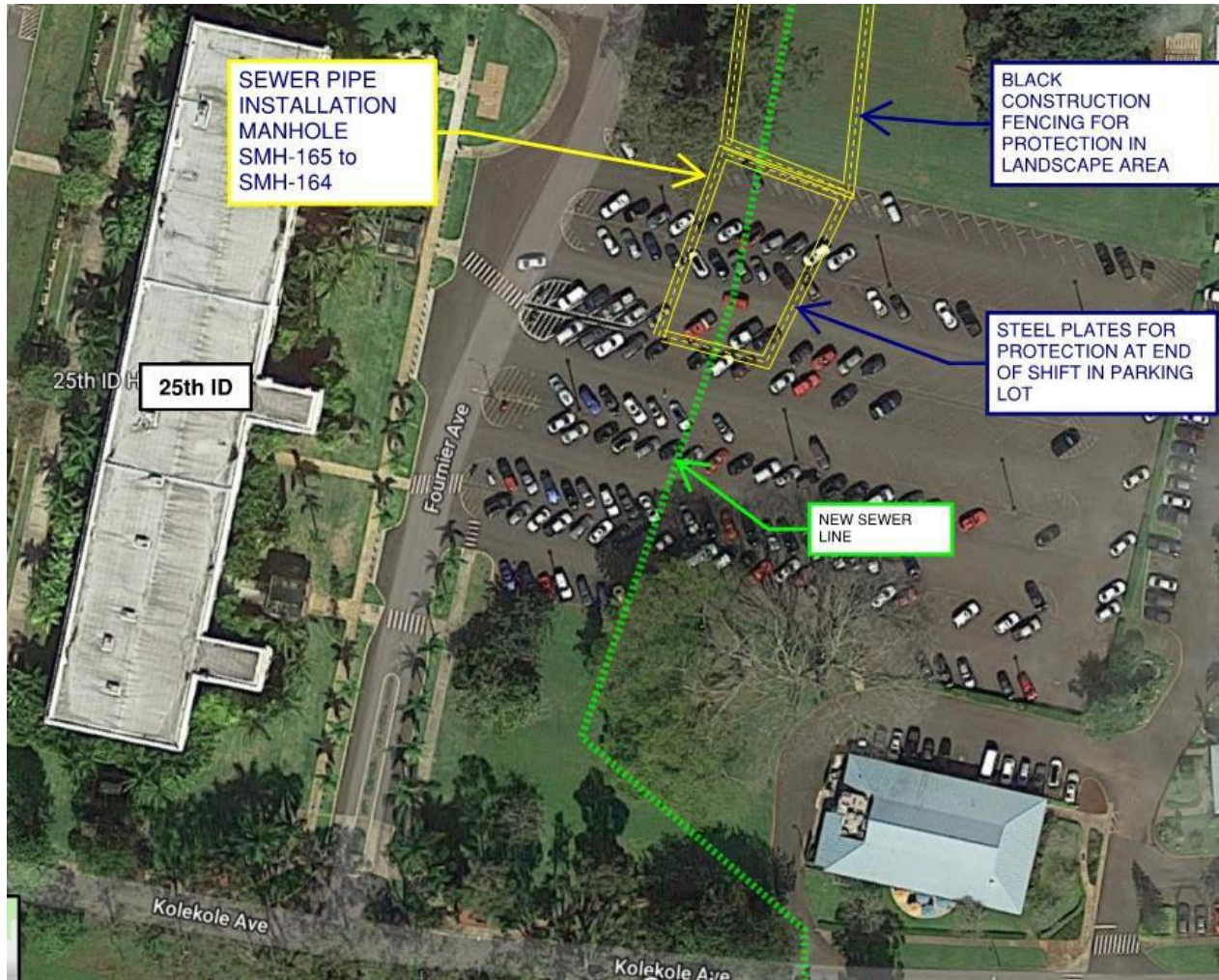

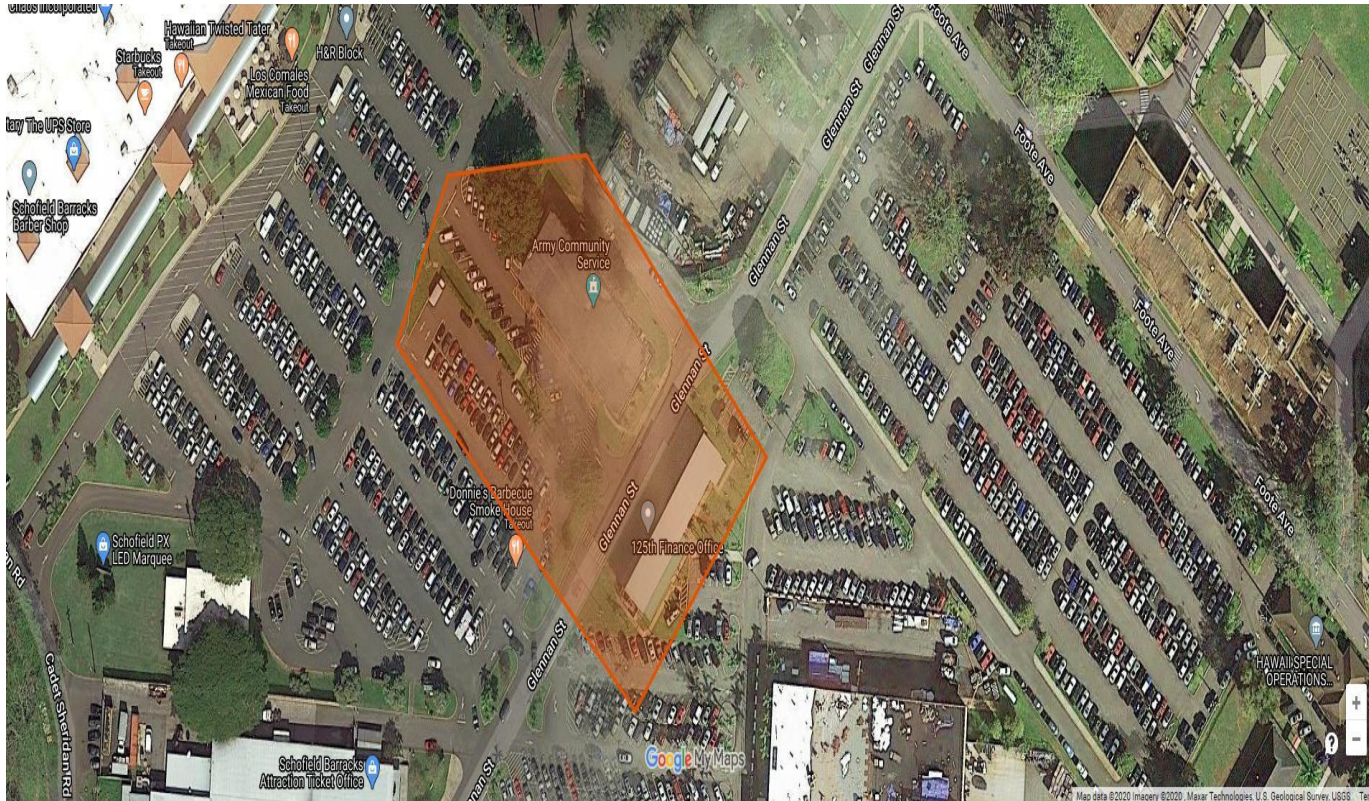

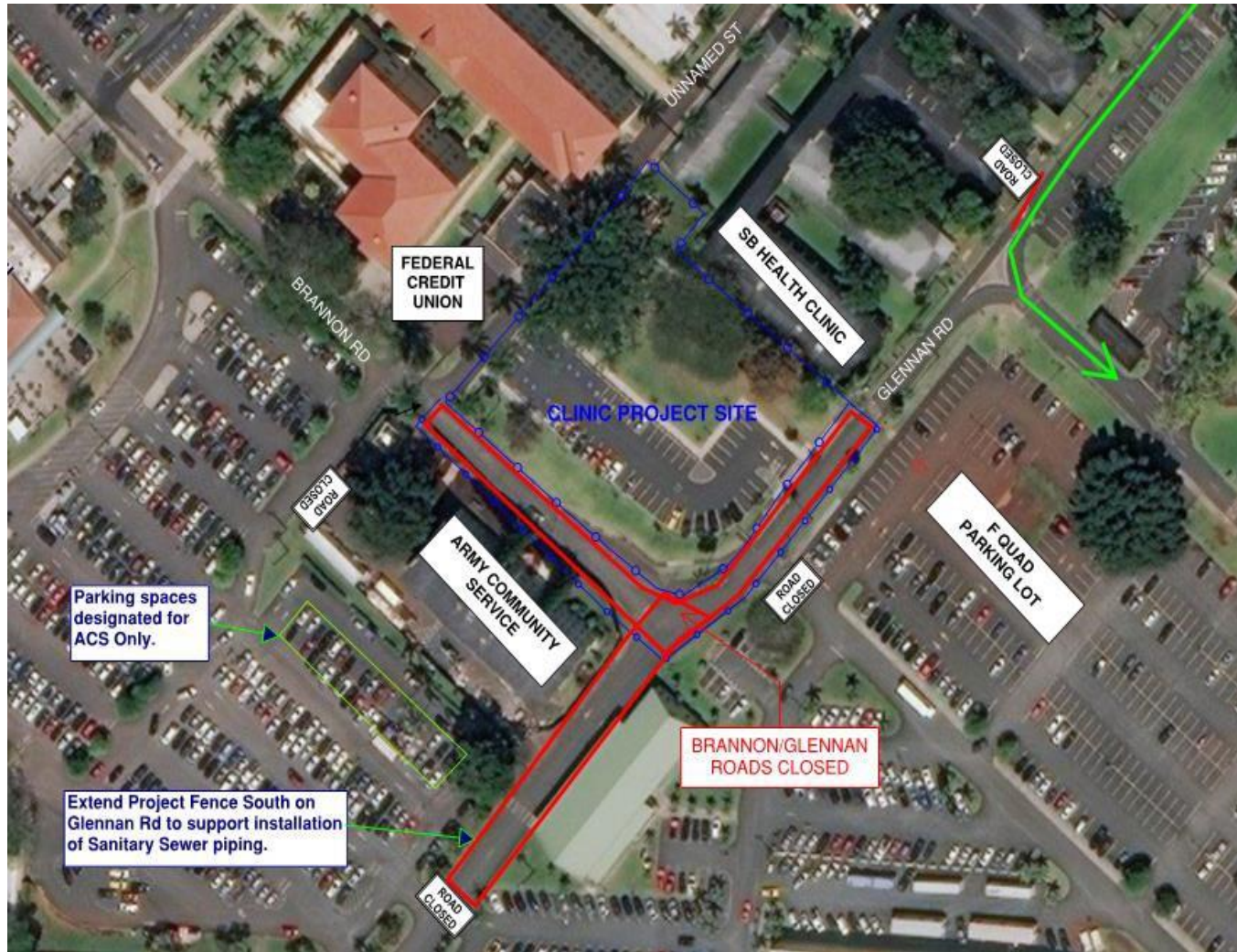

Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) - Arrival

Temporary Policy #06 – Arrival TLA

- ✓ When a Soldier/Family signs in to U.S. Army Garrison Hawaii, TLA may be authorized.
- ✓ While on TLA, personnel are required to search and secure housing within 45 days of arrival.
- ✓ The 45 day timeline includes 14 days for Restriction of Movement (ROM), and 30 days to search for housing. If housing is secured within 45 days of arrival, up to 60 days of TLA may be authorized depending on the move in date and the delivery of household goods to the residence.
 - During ROM, house hunting can be accomplished via online searches, phone calls, etc.
 - To adapt to changing times, on-post housing, off-post housing landlords, property managers and realtors are showing properties virtually or practicing social distancing and cleaning recommendations.
 - All proper safeguards should be observed, including the six-foot social distancing rule as well as wearing a cloth face covering.





Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) - Arrival

- Soldiers are discouraged from signing a lease agreement or purchase contract sight unseen. Upon completion of ROM, the Housing Office recommends Soldiers physically visit and inspect the home prior to signing a housing contract to ensure livability and adequacy.
 - Per the Hawaii Governor's Proclamation, 5 May 2020, real estate services are considered an essential business; travel to and from these businesses is authorized.
 - The U.S. Army has a mission of national defense. Personnel must get settled at their new duty station in order to perform their jobs and execute vital functions of national defense.
- ✓ An ETP for TLA may be submitted for extenuating circumstances. The TLA Authority takes into consideration the daily amount of all payments and expenses received to date and potential for financial hardship before authorizing additional TLA.





Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) - Departure

Temporary Policy #06 – Departure TLA

- ✓ To prevent undue hardship to the Soldiers and Family members who were residing in hotels on Departure TLA when the stop movement order was published, the Garrison Commander signed a memo extending their Departure TLA entitlement until 11 May 2020 or until the stop movement restrictions are lifted.
- ✓ The command encourages all departing Soldiers to retain their residence until the stop movement order is lifted or they have an approved Exception to Policy (ETP) to continue Permanent Change of Station (PCS) travel.
 - Departure TLA may be authorized up to 10 days from the availability date on PCS orders as long as household goods are picked up and the Soldier is not on leave.
 - Soldiers who have Expiration-Term of Service (ETS) or Retirement orders, the stop movement order does not apply and Departure TLA is given 10 days from the availability date, as long as household goods are picked up and the Soldier is not on leave.

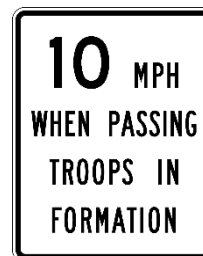

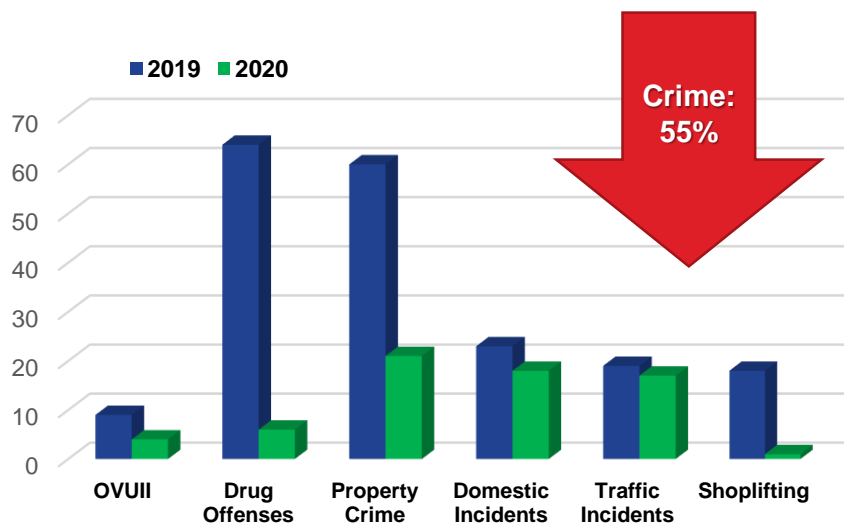

Get A Kit

- ☐ **Water: 1 gallon/person/day for 14 days**
- ☐ **Food: Non-perishable, ready-to-eat items for 14 days**
- ☐ **Blankets and change of clothes**
- ☐ **Flashlight, batteries, and first aid kit**
- ☐ **Personal hygiene items**
- ☐ **Reusable plastic plates, cups, and eating utensils**





Get A Kit (Cont.)

✓ **Make sure your emergency kit also includes items specific to your special needs, for example:**

- ☐ Eyeglasses
- ☐ Medications
- ☐ Infant formula/diapers
- ☐ Food and extra water for pets/service animals

✓ **Additional Items to consider:**

- ☐ Important family documents in a waterproof container
- ☐ Cash, change or traveler's checks
- ☐ Local maps
- ☐ COVID-19 items such as face-masks, wipes, gloves, and hand sanitizer





Make A Plan

Making a plan is simple... just think of the 5 Ws!

- Who: Gather input from all family members
- What: Plan for all hazards that could effect your family
- Where: Establish plans for evacuation and meeting places
- When: Review plan annually or as major changes occur
- Why: Having a plan will enable your family to respond to an emergency more quickly

Making an emergency plan is just the first step; you must practice and adjust it to meet your current needs.





Be Informed

The following are the methods used to warn of an impending danger due to an emergency:

- ☐ Mass Notification/Giant Voice Warning System
- ☐ ALERTS Telephonic Alerts/Notifications
- ☐ Hawaii State Siren and Emergency Alert System
- ☐ TV/Radio Broadcasts
- ☐ Island Palm Communities Call Max System
- ☐ Garrison Website/Facebook/Twitter

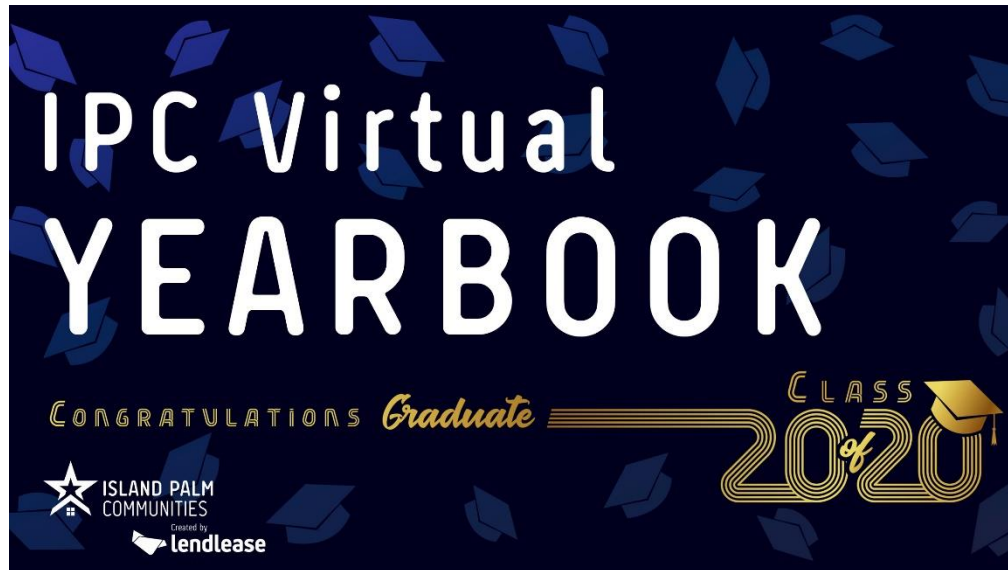

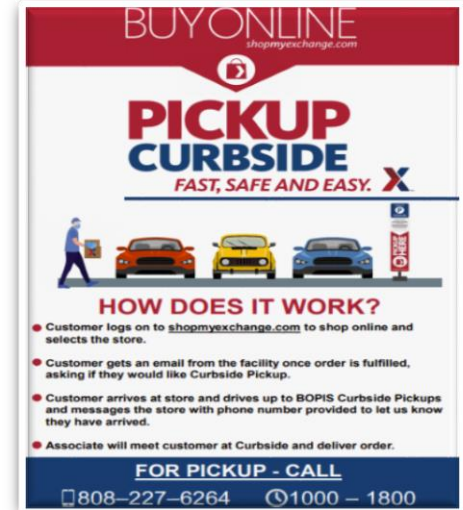
