


AMR/Red Hill Total Property Crimes Jan-Sep 2021

Schofield Barracks

AMR

- The increase in AMR/Red Hill was over a short time period, this is assessed to be an isolated surge as there have been few additional reports since September.
- AMR/ Red Hill property crime is far lower than that occurring on Schofield Barracks. Comparison : 305 property crimes on SB during reported period versus 50 in the same period.
- In response to property crimes on installations and in housing areas, USAG-HI DES has increased patrol numbers and crime prevention operations during hours of darkness and historically targeted areas.

Water Outages / Water Main Replacement Plan

Break	Date	Location	Cause	Remarks / Corrective Actions
①	6/17/2021	Morishige Lane	Pipe Settlement	DPW immediate response to repair; long term plan is complete replacement of water main line
②	8/24/2021	Ironwood Loop	Corporation Stop Failure	Corporation Stop Failure is the failure of the joint that connects the main water line to the home
③	10/5/2021	Begonia Loop	Corporation Stop Failure	Approx. 30% of all AMR water outages are due to corporation stop failures

Aliamanu Military Reservation (AMR) Housing

- [Contact IPC Community Center](#) if water leak occurs in your yard.
- DPW responsible to repair main water lines (i.e. typically, water leaks in the street).



Corrective Action Plan: Replace water main lines over multiple years.

- FY23 Start Construction East Side
- FY24 Start Construction Center Area
- FY28 Start Construction North Side

Aliamanu Military Reservation (AMR) Housing

Precautionary Action: HECO Scheduled Outages

- HECO will conduct pre-construction meetings in future
- HECO/DPW will Enhance communication protocol with POC on outages and delays

Corrective Action: Jumper Wire Burn Out

Jumper Wires have been failing - Emergency Electrical Contract will be used to replace 20 of these across AMR.

Management of Feral Animals

USAG-HI-13 Animal Control Policy – prohibits feeding of wild, feral, stray animals in/out-side USAG-HI facility.

- USAG-HI provides **Animal Control Services** to protect resident health and military property, but this can only be done effectively as an integrated effort by DPW, DES, IPC, Vet Clinic and Residents.
- Residents feeding feral animals undermine USAG-HI control efforts.
- Feral pigs, chickens, and cats threaten health, damage property, and degrade resident and employee quality of life.
- Unregistered and unauthorized pets, stray, and feral animals pose health risk, drain resources, and in tragic cases lead to injury of children.

In 2021

- ✓ 0 Feral Pig Complaints, 0 Removed
 - Most Recent Complaints - Red Hill in 2020
- ✓ 44 Feral Chickens Removed, (4 in October 2021)
- ✓ 6 Feral Cats Removed



Feral Cats

- *Spread disease to humans and pets (toxoplasmosis, fleas, ticks, internal parasites)*
- *Facilities maintenance (cats have kittens in ceiling crawl spaces and in military vehicles, feces under buildings, etc).*
- *Food dumped for cats supports other feral animal populations (rats, chickens, mongoose and pigs).*
- *Spread disease to wildlife (Endangered Hawaiian Monk Seal-toxoplasmosis)*

Feral Chickens

- *Spread disease to humans and pets (salmonella, mites, internal parasites)*
- *Cause expensive damage to landscaping, vehicles, etc.*




Reporting Community Concerns



NEIGHBOR ISSUES

Talk to your neighbors first

Report to community center and/or military police



ABANDONED VEHICLES

Report to military police with vehicle location and description, license plate # and VIN # if available



SPEEDING

Speed limit is generally 25 mph on post; 15 mph in housing areas



BREAK INS

Report crimes or suspicious behavior to military police

Secure your belongings; lock car and home



POTHOLES

Report pot holes and other road hazards to (808) 787-1275



FERAL ANIMALS

Report feral animal activity to (808) 787-1275

Report feeding of feral animals to military police
