

**Notice of Inadvertent Discovery and Call for Claimants Under Native American Graves Protection and Repatriation Act (NAGPRA).**

Two burial sites were inadvertently discovered in the sea cliffs on lands owned by the U.S. Army Garrison, Hawaii at Kahuku Training Area in Pahipahiālua 'Ahupua'a, Ko'olauloa Moku, O'ahu, Hawai'i [TMK: (1) 5-7-002:001].

Archaeologists from the U.S. Army Garrison, Hawaii visited the suspected burial sites and confirmed the presence of human skeletal remains in November 2021.

Based on the context and location, these remains are presumed to be Native Hawaiian and pursuant to 43 CFR § 10.2(d)(1) are subject to the requirements of NAGPRA. The minimum number of individuals at the first burial site is seven.

The minimum number of individuals at the second burial site is two. Both burial sites are within about 100 meters of another burial site that was sealed in 2017

under a NAGPRA Plan of Action. Claimants that participated in the 2017 Plan of Action have been notified. Notice to regular consulting parties with NAGPRA

interests for the area are being issued. *Representatives of Native Hawaiian organizations and/or individuals that wish to claim lineal descent or cultural affiliation with the human remains in accordance with the NAGPRA process are requested to please email the Cultural Resources Section at*
