MEMORANDUM FOR RECORD

SUBJECT: United States Army Hawaii (USARHAW) Policy Letter #9 – The Right of Civilian Employees to Present Complaints or Request Assistance from the Inspector General

1. Reference. Army Regulation 20-1 (Inspector General Activities and Procedures), 23 March 2020.
2. All civilian employees have the right to present complaints, grievances, or requests for assistance to the Inspector General. These complaints or grievances may include what civilian employees reasonably believe to be evidence of fraud, waste, or abuse.
3. Before visiting the Inspector General, employees should consider whether their immediate supervisor can address their concerns in a more prompt manner. However, employees are not required to present their concerns to their chain of command before contacting the Inspector General. If employees wish to visit the Inspector General during the work day, they must obtain permission before being absent from their duties. Employees are not required to tell anyone why they want to speak to an Inspector General.
4. If you have a complaint about matters other than civilian employment, or a complaint about possible regulatory or procedural violations concerning personnel actions you feel your supervisor has failed to (or cannot) resolve, you may visit, call, email, or write your local Inspector General at:

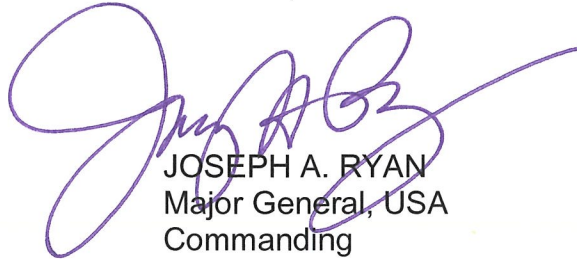

SUBJECT: USARHAW Policy Letter #9 – The Right of Civilian Employees to Present Complaints or Request Assistance from the Inspector General

6. In accordance with Army Regulation 20-1, the Inspector General has a duty to protect confidentiality to the maximum extent possible. This requirement applies to all persons who ask the Inspector General for help, make a complaint, contact or assist an Inspector General during an inspection or investigation, or otherwise interact with an Inspector General.

7. Department of the Army personnel are prohibited from taking any action restricting the filing of a complaint, seeking assistance, or cooperating with the Inspector General. No disciplinary or adverse action may be taken against any individual filing a complaint, seeking assistance, or cooperating with the Inspector General, Special Counsel, or any agency established to receive such complaints. Dishonest or false complaints made to an Inspector General may be subject to disciplinary action.
