





Speed Enforcement

As a friendly reminder speed enforcement will continue throughout USAG-HI in an effort to minimize potential accidents and distracted drivers.

Recently USAG-HI Military Police have observed elevated speed in *housing areas, near school zones, and highly trafficked areas.*

Speed enforcement will continue in order to maintain a safe environment for the USAG-HI Community.

Parking Enforcement

Illegal parking contributes to congestion and slows traffic. Enforcement minimizes these conditions, while reducing the potential for accidents. The best way to avoid or become subject to parking enforcement is to park legally (Refer to USARHAW 190-5, Chapter 4).

“Except as necessary to comply with the law, the direction of law enforcement personnel or an official traffic control device, no person shall stop, stand or park a vehicle in any area not specifically designated as a parking area.”

Vehicle Towing/Abandoned Vehicles

Privately owned vehicles will not be impounded unless the vehicle clearly interferes with ongoing military operations, movement of traffic, threatens public safety or convenience, is involved in criminal activity, contains evidence of criminal activity, or is stolen or *abandoned*.

Capacity to remove abandoned vehicles is severely downgraded until an approved contract is established enabling the removal of abandoned vehicles.



PREVENT KITCHEN FIRES:

Cooking is the biggest cause of home fires and fire injuries. You can prevent cooking fires.

Take these steps to keep your family safe:

- **Stand by your pan:** if you leave the kitchen turn the burner off.
- **Watch what you are cooking:** Fires start when the heat is too high. If you see any smoke or the grease starts to boil, turn off the burner.
- **Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove:** Then no one can bump them or pull them over.
- **Keep a pan lid or baking sheet nearby:** use it to cover the pan if it catches on fire. This will put out the fire.




