


Trimble Road Pavement Rehabilitation & Concrete Median Installation




Traffic Signals at Cadet Sheridan and Trimble Intersection

Installation Animal Policy



Key Policies

- Department of the Army Domestic Animals on Army Installations
- U.S. Army Hawaii Regulation 1
- U.S. Army Garrison, Hawaii
 - USAG-HI 13 Stray and Feral Animal Control
 - USAG-HI 21 Army Installation Microchip Program
 - USAG-HI 22 Prohibited Dog Breeds on Installations
- Island Palm Communities
 - Lease
 - Resident Guide



Applicability:

- This policy applies to all Army installations and all types of Army housing to include Army owned, privatized, and leased.
- For the purpose of this directive, this policy applies only to privately owned animals, specifically those pets owned by Service Members, Government employees, Contractors, including all Family members and all visitors.
- This policy does not address control of department of Defense (DoD)-owned animals, e.g. Military workings Dogs, Government-owned (non Department of Defense) animals, or Non-Appropriated Fund-owned animals (NAF owned animals) such as horses on Army installations.

Background.

- This directive establishes a uniform policy, including minimum standards, for domestic animals on Army installations.
- This policy provides for the safety and welfare of all individuals on Army installations by providing Senior Commanders (SC) the flexibility to tailor their installation domestic animal policies to comply with their specific requirements.
- This directive incorporates the existing pet policy for Army privatized housing (reference 1.a.) and applies it to other types of housing in order to provide Soldiers and Families more predictability with regards to where they can house their pets as they move to different installations.



General:

- The Senior Commander has authority over installation access for all animals, other than service dogs.
- All installations are required to have a domestic animal policy that adheres to the new policy and complies with all applicable federal, state, local laws and regulations, and all installation specific requirements associated with installation access, ownership, registration, control, and vaccination of domestic animals.
- Residents, employees, contractors, or visitors may not bring on any installation, any dog of a breed (including a mixed breed) that is deemed aggressive/dangerous or potentially aggressive/dangerous.
- For purposes of the policy, aggressive/dangerous or potentially aggressive/dangerous breeds of dogs are defined as Pit Bulls (American Staffordshire Bull Terriers or English Staffordshire Bull Terriers), Rottweilers, Doberman Pinschers, Chows, and wolf hybrids. This prohibition also extends to other dogs that demonstrate a propensity for dominant or aggressive/dangerous behavior as indicated by any of the following types of conduct:
 - Unprovoked barking, growling, or snarling when people are present.
 - Aggressively running along fence lines when people are present.
 - Biting or scratching people, or attacking other pets.
 - Escaping confinement or restriction to chase people.



General (Con't):

- It is unauthorized to bring any exotic, wild, or farm species onto any installation Army-wide for other than official purposes.
- Examples of exotic, wild and farm species include but are not limited to the following: exotic animals, fish and reptiles such as alligators, electric eels, monkeys, piranhas, pufferfish, sharks, and snakes; wild animals and birds such as ferrets, foxes, hedgehogs, raccoons, rats, skunks, squirrels, owls, ostriches, and falcons; and farm animals and fowl such as pot-bellied pigs, goats, sheep, chickens, and geese.
- Prior written approval of the Installation Commander is required to bring exotic, wild, or farm species onto the Installation for official purposes.
- The installation access restrictions do not apply to service animals. However, if a
 particular service animal behaves in a way that demonstrate a propensity for
 dominant or aggressive/dangerous behavior, the animal may be barred from the
 installation at the direction of the installation Garrison Commander.
- If a Service Member has authorization to bring onto an installation (for example to receive veterinary services) a dog deemed aggressive/dangerous or potentially aggressive/dangerous, the dog must be muzzled at all times while on the installation.



Family Housing:

- Army Privatized Family Housing must comply with this policy and installation specific domestic animal policies to the extent practical.
- Residents of Army Privatized Family Housing are limited to two dogs, two cats, or one dog and one cat.
- The privatized housing owner is authorized to waive the dog and cat limit after considering the needs of the animal owner/resident, impact to neighboring residents, the expense of additional wear and tear on the dwelling unit, any prior approved waivers, and if any of the dogs or cats are claimed by the animal owner to be a service animal, assistance animal, companion animal, emotional support animal, activity animal, or therapy animal.

Unaccompanied Housing (UH):

 Army-owned UH. UH residents are prohibited from keeping animals in their building. However, a UH resident may be authorized to keep a service dog.

Privatized Army Lodging:

 This policy and installation specific domestic animal policies apply to Privatized Army Lodging.





U.S. Army Hawaii Regulation

U.S. Army Hawaii Standards and Discipline:

- Pets, General Prohibitions 3-21:
 - Individuals will not abandon animals on or outside USAG-HI installations.
 - Feeding of feral animals is prohibited.
 - Individuals will not raise or breed pets housed on USAG-HI installations for consumption or commercial purposes.
 - Pets are not allowed on Fort DeRussy except for seeing-eye dogs and service animals.
 - Aquarium fish are the only authorized pets in Unaccompanied Soldier Housing. Aquarium tanks in Unaccompanied Personnel Housing must be smaller than 5 gallons or have dimensions smaller Than 16 inches in length, 8 inches in width and 10 inches in height.
 - The housing or boarding of wild animals, farm animals, and exotic animals (examples: pigs, rats, mice, chickens, monkeys, reptiles, spiders, snakes) in or outside Island Palm Communities quarters is prohibited.



U.S. Army Garrison, Hawaii Policy

USAG-HI Policy:

- USAG-HI-13, Stray and Feral Animal Control: This policy establishes the local policy and
 procedures governing the possession and control of animals maintained on USAG-HI installations
 or brought onto any of its installations in order to provide stray and feral animal control. This
 includes those measures necessary to protect the health, safety, and harmonious coexistence of
 personnel, their family members, their animals, and wildlife populations on the installations.
- USAG-HI-21, Army Installation Microchip Program: This policy establishes the requirement to have a working identification microchip implanted under the animals skin in order to locate the registered address and owner should a pet become lost or abandoned on a the installation. Pet owners have 14 days of arriving on the installation to microchip and register their pets with the applicable Veterinary Treatment Facility (VTF) at Schofield Barracks or Fort Shafter.
- USAG-HI-22 Prohibited Dog Breeds on USAG-HI Installations: This policy establishes the local policy for prohibited dog breeds. A certified veterinarian, military or civilian, will determine if a dog is a pit bull or other prohibited breed. Original or notarized copies of American or United Kennel Club registrations identifying the dog as a breed other than the prohibited breeds or breed types may serve as proof of owner compliance with this policy. This policy does not affect access to treatment at Veterinarian Treatment Facilities (VTF) located on USAG-HI installations. (The VTFs are located at Building 936, Duck Road, Schofield Barracks and at Building 435, Pierce Road, Fort Shafter.) *Latest DA Policy requires dogs to be muzzled while on the installation



Island Palm Communities

IPC Lease:

Maintaining pets within IPC is a privilege extended to Residents. Resident
must request and obtain written approval prior to bringing into the Premises,
either on a permanent or temporary basis. A Pet Addendum must be
completed at move-in or immediately after acquiring a new pet. Residents
are responsible for their pets behavior and damages. Lease requires
residents to comply with applicable laws, conditions, restrictions, orders,
regulations and Resident Guide issued by the Installation Commander and
Landlord

IPC Resident Guide:

- IPC policies enhance the existing rules for control and treatment of pets and wild animals. All existing Department of Army Regulations as well as USAG, Hawaii regulations are in effect
- Owners must register pets with their Island Palm Communities community center; a maximum of two pets in any combination will be allowed
- Residents may not board any dog of a breed (including a mixed breed) that is deemed
 "aggressive or potentially aggressive" unless the dog is a certified military working dog
 that is being boarded by its handler/trainer.

Island Palm Communities

IPC Resident Guide (Cont.):

- All dogs and cats must wear pet collars; pet collars must have a current rabies immunization tag attached
- Pet owners must have proof of immunization by a certified veterinarian that is valid for at least 12 months
- Residents whose pets have litters must notify their respective community center and make arrangements for adoption within twelve (12) weeks of birth
- Outdoor pets that are unsupervised must be contained within a fenced area. Pets leashed, but not contained within a fenced area must be supervised at all times. Pets must not be left tied anywhere or left unattended in carports or garages. Pets are strictly prohibited from running loose. Pets are not allowed to create a noise disturbance in the community
- Residents are required to maintain a sanitary living environment for their pets and are required to clean animal waste on a daily basis; animal waste occurring while walking a pet must be cleaned immediately



Installation Animal Policy Feral Animals



Feral Animals

- Hawaii has significant challenges regarding feral animal populations
- Research reveals state and island wide concerns related to feral animals and the impacts associated
- Feral animals can disrupt ecosystems, cause disease and in some cases, contribute to extinction of indigenous species.
- Army installations are not exempt from the feral animal challenges
 - Health, welfare, safety, sanitation and other inherent responsibilities
 - Military installations have another unique set of challenges relating to readiness.
- Responsible pet owners are key to successful stray animal control
 - Follow Army Policies and Regulations
 - Vaccinate, identify via tags and chips, and properly control their pets



Impacts of Feral Animals

Chickens

- Diseases Avian Influenza, Salmonella-Transmitted through contact and ingestion of contaminated fecal material, mites
- Property Damage Cause damage to turf and landscaping by scratching areas bare and creating nests within the landscape.
- Soldier fitness concerns Interrupt sleep by crowing and/or cackling

Cats

- Diseases-Toxoplasmosis (ingestion of fecal contaminated material), cat scratch fever (scratch or bite of infected cat), fleas, allergies
- Property damage-Spraying and marking, fecal contamination, strong odor
- Soldier fitness concern-interrupted sleep from yowling and fighting (unfixed cats)
- Wildlife damage-Kill native and non-native birds, lizards, amphibians, etc...

Mongoose

- Diseases-Leptospirosis (intake of water contaminated by mongoose, usually when swimming or playing in fresh water), fleas
- Wildlife damage-Kill native and non-native birds, lizards, amphibians, etc...

<u>Pigs</u>

- Diseases-Swine Brucellosis (contact with body fluids), Salmonella (ingestion of fecal contaminated material), tapeworm (ingestion of fecal contaminated material or consumption of undercooked meat), leptospirosis (intake of water contaminated by pigs, usually when swimming or playing in fresh water), possible influenza bridge.
- Property damage-Extensive damage to landscaping through rooting behavior.
 Increases breeding habitat of diseasetransmitting mosquitoes (Dengue, Chikungunya, Zika)
- Safety-Feral swine become aggressive when they are being fed and see people as a source of food.
- More aggressive if they have young.
- Can cause significant injuries through bites and/or goring with tusks.





Current Efforts

Current Efforts:

- Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) with other federal agency for control of pigs, chickens and cats.
- Pilot Trap Neuter Release Management (TNRM) program for cats at Fort Shafter.
 - Reduction of complaints from trouble areas where program has been established.
 - Some continued complaints in areas where program not in place, or recently instituted.
- Directorate of Public Works is developing contract for animal control (domestic, feral, and wild animals).



Future Efforts

Chickens:

- Continue MOA Control Efforts
- Future actions will include chicken round-ups combined with stalking, netting and trapping to reduce the population
- Prevention:
 - Grounds maintenance Cleanup fruit trees, minimize nesting materials and shelter
 - No Feeding
- Reporting:
 - Community/residents are highly encourage to report feral animals in their areas to the DPW work order desk 656-1275

<u>Pigs:</u>

- Continue MOA Control Efforts
- Prevention:
 - No Feeding
 - Monitoring and maintaining fence lines to prevent incursion from wild areas
- Reporting:
 - Encourage to report feral animals in their areas to the DPW work order desk 656-1275 Reporting:

<u>Cats:</u>

- Implementing Pilot TNRM Program at Schofield Barracks and monitor for effectiveness.
- Feeding is prohibited other than authorized Pilot TNRM care givers





Future

Future:

- Continue with agreements/partnerships with other agencies to remove/control the feral animal populations (pigs, chickens, cats) within the Army installations in Hawaii.
 - Contractors
 - Federal Agencies
 - State/Local Agencies
 - Non-profit organizations
- Enforcement of Domestic, Feral, and Stray Animal Policies by DES (USAG-HI), USARHAW, and Island Palms Community
- Installations with large feral/stray animal issues: Schofield Barracks, Fort Shafter, Wheeler Army Airfield, Helemano Military Reservation, Tripler Army Medical Hospital, Aliamanu Military Reservation.
