





Housing Update

- Housing efforts
 - Leadership is monitoring all life, health, and safety reports from initial receipt through completion.
 - Chain of Command has visited homes and barracks spaces
 - The DAIG has visited the installation
 - The partner (IPC) is more responsive to Soldiers/families





Unaccompanied Personnel Housing Office

- Unaccompanied Personnel Housing (UPH) Office is coordinating the following tasks in support of USAG-HI implementation of the Army Barracks Management Program (ABMP):
 - Brigades are now responsible for the barracks and furnishings within their footprint
 - Brigades are currently signing for their barracks
 - Company Commanders are currently signing for furnishings in their unit's designated bed spaces
 - UPH is providing enterprise Military Housing (eMH) training to leadership and unit personnel
 - UPH is updating eMH to accurately reflect number of barracks / available bed spaces within the garrison; accurately accounting for occupancy supports issuing Certificates of Non-Availability when needed
- The Furnishings Management Office (FMO) is supporting reconciliation of all furnishings in the garrison's barracks. Support includes:
 - Change out of non-functional furnishings
 - Pick-up or turn-in of missing or excessive furnishings respectively
 - Provision of bar code labels for furnishings
 - Accounting for all barracks furnishings in eMH
 - Printing and maintaining furnishings hand receipts

- Tow vehicle and complete DD 2505 & DD 2506
- Title last registered owner (H.R.S. 290-12)
- Trash / dispose of vehicle IAW AR 190-5 & DoDM 4160.21

Max Speed Limits

- 15 mph in all housing areas, unless otherwise posted
- 15 mph in all school zones during school hours, unless otherwise posted
- 10 mph when entering or exiting access control points
- 10 mph in any parking area, motor pool or motor park, unless otherwise posted
- 10 mph when passing troops

Suspension or Revocation of Installation Driving Privileges IAW USARHAW Regulation 190-5

An accumulation of 12 traffic points within 12 months or 18 traffic points within 24 months will result in a suspension of installation driving privileges for a period of six months

Receipt of four parking tickets within one year results in a 90 day suspension of on-post driving privileges

Driving while suspended results in revocation of on-post driving privileges for five years

Includes suspensions of state law and suspensions in conjunction with USARHAW 190-5



Motorcycle Safety

Recent incidents show an increase in motorcycle accidents and infractions of the motorcycle safety policy and regulations.

- Fluorescent (brightly colored) and reflective vest, jacket, or upper garment or a motorcycle specific jacket, vest or apparel
- Full-fingered gloves (made from leather or other abrasion-resistant material)
- Backpacks will have a minimum of two PT belts visible for the rear, unless the backpack is fluorescent or reflective in design by the manufacturer.
- Eye protection designed to meet or exceed ANSI Z87.1 reference (z), goggles, wrap around glasses, or full face shield
- Military personnel must complete an approved Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF)
 Basic Riders Course (BRC) before operating any motorcycle on USAG HI installations
 and sites.
